Winter Storm Update from DESPP / DEMHS...

STATUS OF THE STATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER - ACTIVATED

Heavy Snow Still Occurring in Parts of Eastern CT...

At 9:00 AM radar continues to show bands of light to moderate snow across Western CT and bands of moderate to occasionally heavy snow in Eastern CT. Current temperatures are in the mid to upper teens across the state. Winds are gusting from the North at 25 - 35 MPH. Total snowfall currently ranges from 3" - 5" in far Western CT, 8" - 16" in Central CT up to 24" in parts of Eastern CT.

The snowfall intensity will gradually subside during the next 4 - 5 hours and is forecast to be light this afternoon with some additional light accumulations. Total snowfall for this event is now forecast to range from 4" - 6" in far Western CT, 10" - 16" in Central CT and up to 18" - 28" in Eastern CT.

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection will continue to monitor this storm and will send out another update along with an updated snowfall map at 11:15 AM.
