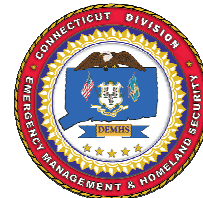

STATUS OF THE STATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER – MONITORING

Good Morning,

At 11:30 AM radar showed rain falling across most of the state with winds along the coast gusting to 30 – 35 MPH at times. Temperatures currently range from the mid 30's in Northern CT up to the mid 40's along the coast. At 11:30 AM CL&P and UI were only reporting a total of 125 Customers without power across the state.

A strong cold front will move from West to East across Connecticut this afternoon. Temperatures may briefly rise into the 50's just prior to the arrival of the cold front with winds along the coast gusting to 35 MPH from the South at times between 1:00 – 3:00 PM. Winds are then forecast to shift to the West as the front passes and may gust as high as 45 MPH at times across most of the state between 3:00 – 10:00 PM. Although no advisories have been issued by the National Weather Service at this time, towns may experience some minor tree and powerline damage as a result of the gusty winds.

The winds are forecast to subside tonight between 10:00 PM and midnight.

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security will continue to monitor the latest conditions, however this will be the only update on this event unless the forecast changes or advisories are issued by the NWS.
