


### WEATHER MAP FOR 7:30 AM THIS MORNING

### SNOW/SLEET FORECAST FOR WEDNESDAY



### NWS CONTINUES WINTER STORM WARNINGS AND ADVISORIES FOR ALL OF CONNECTICUT FOR TODAY.

At 7:00 AM Temperatures Statewide ranged from the low teens in the valleys of the NW Hills to the low 20's along the coast. Snow / Sleet and Freezing Rain were falling across the entire state and winds were NE at 15 - 20 MPH.

**This Morning...** In the NW Hills... Moderate Sleet from 8:00 AM until Noon with temperatures in the teens. Snow may mix in at times during periods of heavy precipitation. In the Hartford Area... Sleet and Freezing Rain moderate at times between 7:00 AM - Noon with temperatures around 20 F. Along the Coast and In Southeastern CT... Freezing Rain with some glazing on roadways and trees. Temperatures in the mid 20's. Moderate mixed sleet and freezing rain during the morning rush hour will make driving very slick in most areas.

**This Afternoon...** In the NW Hills... Moderate Sleet changing over to moderate to heavy snow for a few hours during mid-afternoon, highs around 20 F. In the Hartford Area... Sleet and Freezing Rain mixing with snow at times with temperatures in the mid 20's. Along the Coast and In Southeastern CT... Freezing Rain and rain with some glazing on roadways and trees. Temperatures in the upper 20's. The heaviest precipitation should occur between noon and 4:00 PM. After 4:00 PM the precipitation will tend to lighten up.

**Tonight...** Any steady mixed precipitation in extreme Eastern CT changing back to snow and tapering off to light snow between 7:00 PM and 10:00 PM. Some light snow may continue overnight with an inch or so of additional accumulation. Lows in the teens. Total sleet / snow / freezing rain is currently forecast to range from 1 - 2 inches along the Southeast coast up to 2 - 4 inches in the Hartford Area and 4 - 6 inches in the extreme NW Hills. (NOTE: Snowfall just to the NW of Connecticut is forecast to range from 15 - 25 inches in the Albany Area). Strong NE winds of 30 - 40 MPH are expected during the day today especially along the coast and in higher elevations. Strong NW winds at 25 - 35 MPH (Gusts to 50 MPH) are expected tonight and Thursday morning as the low intensifies and moves away from our area. These winds may cause some power outages across the state. The next forecast will be issued by DEMHS at 2:00 PM this afternoon or sooner if the forecast changes significantly.
