Our Mission is Veteran Recovery

The Veterans Recovery Center (VRC), at the Fellowship House, is co-located on the grounds of the Connecticut Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) under the auspices of the Connecticut Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS).

The program at the VRC is designed to assist and support eligible Veterans with substance use disorders with their recovery needs.

The VRC interfaces with other services provided on the grounds of the DVA, whose primary focus is on educational and vocational referrals, employment counseling, and job placement assistance.

We take incredible pride caring for our Veterans who have sacrificed so much for our country. It is our honor to assist them to achieve their goals; free from addiction.

Our Program

The VRC offers outpatient services along with an optional four week Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) with twelve hours required per week.

Just as no two Veterans are alike, recovery plans are individualized for each client. Our treatment staff assess a Veteran's goals and matches them to scheduled individual and group sessions.

These sessions are the core of our program as they provide clarity to the recovery process, aid in confronting personal barriers to recovery, and assist the Veteran to generate momentum toward stable, long-term abstinence from substances.

At the VRC, we also have access to an expanded range of recovery and rehabilitative services to include:

- Relapse Prevention
- 12-Step Groups
- Anger Management
- Meditation

These services and optional services are available outside of the twelve hour per week IOP.

Admissions

Veterans in the community and Veterans currently residing in the Residential Facility at the DVA are eligible for the substance abuse program at the VRC. For more information and to schedule an assessment call, 860.616.3832.
