## **FOUR ANIMALS SEIZED IN NEGLECT CASES OFFERED FOR ADOPTION AT ANNUAL UCONN AUCTION** *By Ray Connors, Supervising Animal Control Officer*

Two donkeys, a mule and a horse seized by the Department of Agriculture in cruelty and neglect cases will be offered for adoption this Saturday at UConn's annual Spring Horse Auction.

The animals have been living at the department's Second Chance animal rescue facility located at York Correctional Institution in Niantic, where inmates assist agriculture department staff in their care.

"Our team at the Second Chance Large Animal Rehabilitation Facility has worked hard to bring these animals back to health so they can find new homes," Agriculture Commissioner Steven K. Revczky said. "Proceeds from their sale will go directly into our rehabilitation program, ensuring that other animals will get the kind of care that these were fortunate enough to receive."

More than 230 horses, mules and donkeys as well as other various livestock and poultry have been rehabilitated at the facility since it opened in 2003.

The annual auction, along with a tack and equipment sale, is held by UConn's College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, and benefits the Equine Science Program in the Department of Animal Science. About a dozen animals are to be auctioned, and the agriculture department is offering the following:

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## **DOCUMENTARY TO FEATURE "FAIRY TALE" STORY OF HORSE REHABILITATED BY DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE** *By Steve Jensen, Office of Commissioner Steven K. Revczky*

A former champion barrel racer horse that was rehabilitated by the agriculture department is having his story made into a movie by the New York City filmmaker who adopted him.

Kelly Colbert's "Midnight in Montana" documentary will recount the journey of a Quarter Horse that was brought to the department's Second Chance animal rescue facility after being seized from a Fairfield County horse farm whose owner was charged with animal cruelty.

A champion barrel racer in Montana, where he was known as Midnight, the horse was put up for adoption at age 14 and was bought by the Easton horse farm, where he was named Blackie.

In 2011, the agriculture department received a complaint that horses were being mistreated at the farm.

Part of the evidence was a video shot by a visitor that showed an emaciated Blackie limping and searching for food in his paddock. The agriculture department seized Blackie and four other of the more than 100 horses living at the farm.

Blackie was found lying in mud and suffering from a severe respiratory condition that made breathing so difficult his nostrils had become grotesquely enlarged. He was also severely malnourished and depressed when he arrived at Second Chance.

- **Firecracker** - a donkey gelding with a sweet personality that loves attention and is easy to handle. Although in his mid-20s, he is very playful with other donkeys and horses, especially the younger ones. He would make a great companion for any equine. He is good for the farrier and the vet and has no known health conditions.
- **Tri** - a donkey in her late 20s, easy to handle and very gentle. She is quiet natured, gets along with everyone and anything on the farm, and enjoys being groomed and sunbathing. She has no vices or known health conditions and is good for the farrier and vet.
- **Moss** - a 15-year-old female mule, gentle but spunky. She enjoys running around and playing with her herd mates, and likes to be in charge of the others but is not aggressive. She is easy to handle, but can be a bit timid with new situations. Moss has no vices, and is good for the farrier and vet.
- **Isis** - a 25-year-old grey Arabian mare that stands 14.2 hands high. She has been owned by the state for several years, and would make a lovely riding partner after getting some saddle time. Although not a fan of other horses, she thrives on human affection. She is not easily spooked and is wonderful for the vet and the farrier. Isis is used to teach new workers how to handle horses, and is beginner-safe as far as ground work goes. She has some minor arthritis in her hocks, but has had no major known health issues.

The sale preview begins at 11 a.m. and the auction of about a dozen animals starts at 1 p.m. at the Horsebarn Hill Arena on the Storrs campus. The horses being offered by UConn have had extensive use in various equine programs at the university.

All animals have current vaccinations, health certificates and negative Coggins tests. Each also has a microchip (LifeChip®) for identification purposes. All records will be available to prospective buyers.

"In his condition, the odds of him being adopted were minimal," Supervising Animal Control Officer Ray Connors said Monday as Colbert's film crew toured the barn where Blackie had fully recovered after about a year's stay. "We were wondering if he would have to spend the rest of his life here."

Colbert got involved in 2012 when she saw a friend's Facebook posting about the case and immediately decided she wanted to adopt Blackie, (seen below left), who now lives at a horse farm in rural New Jersey near Colbert's home and remains in great health.

"Blackie's story really is a fairy tale," Colbert said after Monday's filming. "And I'm telling it from the horse's point of view. The humans are just accessories."

Colbert had produced a documentary three years ago exposing "puppy mills" that was shown on HBO. Her immediate goal for "Midnight in Montana" is entry into next year's internationally-known Sundance Film Festival.

"It may sound corny but I do this to give these animals a voice," Colbert said.

Connors said Blackie's case is among the most rewarding he has seen.

"This horse was so close to dying and now he has this great life," Connors said. "To see his eyes brighten up and him start to interact with other horses and people was fantastic. He got a chance to be a horse again."
