Now in its 12th season, the Department of Agriculture's Passport to Connecticut Farm Wineries has proven to be extremely effective in drawing visitors to the 34 farm wineries in the state.

The program encourages participants to visit the wineries in order to collect as many "stamps" as possible in their Passport book in order to qualify for prize drawings. Passport booklets, which list and describe each farm winery, are distributed at the wineries between May and November.

In 2015, the agriculture department estimated that the program generated nearly \$1 million in direct sales for wineries. And many winery owners say that figure is likely dwarfed by the associated economic activity generated by visitors in surrounding shops, restaurants and other venues.

The program is a marketing project of the Connecticut Farm Wine Development Council (FWDC), which is made up of members representing the diversity of the state's farm wineries, and is under the agriculture department for administrative purposes.

Agriculture Commissioner Steven K. Reviczky, who chairs the FWDC, is pleased to welcome two new farm wineries into the program for this season: Lebanon Green Vineyards in Lebanon and Rosabianca Vineyards in Northford.

"The real beauty of these farm wineries and the Passport program is not just about making and selling wine," he said. "It's about growing the fruit that's in the wine."

The department is promoting the Passport program all this month on several broadcast and internet radio stations in Connecticut through a USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant.
