Trail Highlights



This trail is a section of the Farmington Canal Heritage Trail that is planned to run from New Haven, north to the Massachusetts border. This section is planned to begin at the Simsbury town line and runs north crossing Floydville Road and then crosses Salmon Brook. The trail then crosses Route 189 and continues north across Route 20 then Copper Hill Road. The trail then continues to the town line, where it will connect with Suffield's planned portion of the trail. While the trail does not connect directly to this site, an interesting destination in the area is the Old Newgate Prison and Copper Mine located on Newgate Road.

Parking and Accessibility

There is no designated parking available for trail users.

From I-91 North or South: Take exit 40, the Route 20/Bradley Airport Connector. Follow Route 20 for 3 miles past the Bradley Airport exit and take a right onto Newgate Road. Follow Newgate Road north until the intersection with Copper Hill Road. Take a left onto Copper Hill Road. The trail joins Copper Hill Road 0.25 miles from the intersection.
