



Canton Farmington River Trail



Trail Highlights

This trail is a section of the Farmington River Trail, a 10.5-mile trail that begins at Meadow Road in Farmington and ends in Canton. This 2.5-mile section begins at the Burlington town line where the trail crosses the Farmington River on a restored railroad bridge. The trail runs in a northeast direction, paralleling the Farmington River to the vicinity of Old River Road. From this point the trail is still in the planning stages, and is expected to run east crossing Route 179, Hill Street, and Atwater Road. The trail is planned to continue east for 2 miles until passing Bond Pond and then reaching its terminus at US Route 202/44. From this point the trail is envisioned to continue to the Simsbury town line and eventually meet with the Farmington Canal Heritage Trail.

Parking and Accessibility

Limited parking available at the Town Hall.

From I-84: Take exit 39 to Route 4 West. Follow Route 4 to the intersection with Route 179 in Burlington. Then follow Route 179 into the center of Canton. The trail crosses Route 179 just west of the Farmington River.
