



Middlebury Larkin State Park Trail

Trail Highlights

The trail is a section of a 9-mile continuous trail that begins in Southbury and ends in Naugatuck. This 2-mile section begins at Long Meadow Road and the Oxford town line, where it connects with Oxford's portion of the Larkins State Park Trail. The trail heads northeast until it crosses South Street and continues until intersecting Wooster Road. From here it continues another mile before it reaches its terminus at Shattuck Road and the Naugatuck town line, where the trail connects with Naugatuck's portion of the Larkin State Park Trail.



Remember, horses have the right of way.

Parking and Accessibility

Limited parking for 2 to 3 cars on South Street. (For additional parking, see page 60.)

From I-84: Take exit 17 to Route 63 South. Follow Route 63 South for about 1.4 miles to Allerton Farms Road. The road will intersect with the Naugatuck section of the trail after about 0.7 miles.
