

Bethel and Redding Huntington Park

Trail Highlights



These trails are part of the 900-acre Huntington State Park. There are a number of routes to take, each offering different types of scenery and terrain. The trails travel along and across a number of brooks, streams and lakes offering locations for fishing, in addition to trail use. These trails also connect several of the local roads in the area such as Sunny View Drive, Hopewell Woods Road and Old Dodgingtown Road.

Parking and Accessibility

Parking is provided in a field located off of Sunset Hill Road, across from Sunny View Drive.

From I-84: Take exit 10 onto Route 6 West. Follow this to the intersection with Route 25. Go south onto Route 25 until the intersection with Route 302. Go west on Route 302 into Bethel and turn south onto Wolfpits Road. This road will become Sunset Hill Road; follow this into Redding. The parking area will be on the east side of Sunset Hill Road, across from Sunny View Drive.
