



Lebanon Lebanon Town Green

Trail Highlights

This walking, jogging, and biking trail located on the Lebanon Town Green provides a scenic view of historic Lebanon Center. The 1.5-mile trail meanders around the perimeter of the green passing several private and public homes and other historic sites on Route 87 and West Town Street. Granite benches are located along the path providing convenient rest areas for visitors. The Lebanon Green has been placed on the National Register of Historic Places and is one of the few remaining greens which is still actively farmed. Among the historic sites adjacent to the green are the Governor Jonathan Trumbull House (erected 1735), the Beaumont House, Wadsworth Stable, and the Revolutionary War Office. Tours are offered at each attraction. The Jonathan Trumbull, Jr., Museum is located across Route 87 along with the new Lebanon Historical Society Museum Visitor Center.

Parking and Accessibility



Parking is available on the south end of the green at the Jonathan Trumbull Library or, when available, at the Lebanon Community Center on the corner of Routes 87 and 207.

From the Willimantic Area: Take Route 289 South to Route 87 South.

From the Norwich Area: Take the Route 2/32 connector to Route 87 North.

From the Colchester Area: Take Route 16 to Route 207 and proceed east to Lebanon.
