The Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) is seeking to engage one (1) prequalified consultant engineering firm, in the category listed above, to provide Construction Engineering and Inspection services for the following assignment:

Project No. 0092-0688 – This Project consists of the Rehabilitation of Bridge #03093, I-91 over Front Street and the Quinnipiac River in New Haven. Construction work will include blasting and painting of beam ends, class 1 containment and collection of surface preparation debris, jacking and bearing replacement, structural steel repairs, partial and full depth deck repairs, class S concrete repairs, asphaltic and silicone joint repairs, sign installation and bituminous paving. This project is scheduled to be advertised on August 10, 2016, with a scope code of “H”.

Information regarding the licensing, certification and qualification requirements for this project can be found in the “Construction Engineering and Inspection Information Pamphlet for Consultants” dated August 2008. (This Pamphlet can be found online at www.ct.gov/dot under the publications link.)

Firms responding to this request should be of adequate size and sufficiently staffed and experienced to perform this assignment and will be required to provide the necessary staffing upon execution of the contract. It is anticipated this will be a project specific contract, and will utilize cost plus-fixed fee payment method.

Please be advised that the Department currently utilizes SiteManager software for construction management reporting. Firms should also be familiar with the Department’s construction policies as outlined in our Construction Manual. (This Manual can also be found online at www.ct.gov/dot/construction under the publications link.)

If your firm desires to be considered for this assignment, your submittal should consist of a one page letter of interest and ConnDOT Form CSO 255(Rev. Jan. 2016), and up to a maximum of four (4) resumes of the key personnel, which are limited to two (2) pages each. One of the resumes must be that of the proposed resident engineer, and another of the proposed Office Engineer, as well as assurance that they will be available for work when required. The CSO 255 Form can be found online at www.ct.gov/dot/business/consultant/selection. **Four (4) copies of the submittal are required and they must be either postmarked by, or, if hand delivered, received by 3:00 p.m. on August 18, 2016.** Firms, who are shortlisted based on their CSO 255 submittal, will be notified by the Consultant Selection Office of the time and date for their final selection interview. A final selection is anticipated by October 31, 2016.

Your CSO 255 submittal should identify the following: your proposed current staff and their qualifications, experience, and availability to perform the required services. Your submittal will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- (1) Experience, qualification and availability of current staff, including sub-consultants, proposed for this assignment. Weighted scoring value = 15%
- (2) Highway Construction. Weighted scoring value = 5%

- (3) Bridge Rehabilitation and/or Construction. Weighted scoring value = 15%
- (4) Bridge Painting. Weighted scoring value = 30%
- (5) Administration of construction projects. Weighted scoring value = 10%
- (6) Required NETTCP certifications (Certified Concrete Technician, Hot Mix Asphalt Paving Inspector, NACE Coating Certified or SSPC Bridge Coating Inspectors). Weighted scoring value = 10%
- (7) Familiarity with ConnDOT's construction inspection standards and procedures. Weighted scoring value = 15%

Proposed personnel shall meet the following requirements:

The Resident Engineer shall meet the Resident Engineer 2 requirements listed in the Information Pamphlet for Consulting Engineers (Pamphlet).

The Chief Inspector ([Bridge Painting](#)) must meet the requirements in the Pamphlet for Chief Inspector and also have at least three years' experience in the inspection of bridge painting. The chief must be NACE certified and have completed session I, II, and III, or have SSPC-BCI Level 1 certification.

The Senior Inspector ([Bridge Painting](#)) must meet the requirements in the Pamphlet for [Inspection Staff Senior Inspector](#) and also have at least two years' experience in the inspection of bridge painting. The inspector must be NACE certified and have completed session I, II, and III, or have SSPC-BCI Level 1 certification.

At least two members of the proposed team must be ATSSA trained and shall have at least five years' experience in interstate maintenance and protection of traffic and stage construction techniques.

Responding firms must provide copies of the required licenses and certifications for the proposed personnel showing that they are in current standing.

This will be a cost-plus, fixed-fee contract. All firms are advised that the prime consultant must perform at least seventy-five (75) percent of the work with employees of the firm. Sub consultant assignments will be permitted for portions of the work up to twenty-five (25) percent of the agreement value. Joint venturing assignments will not be allowed.

You are advised that a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal applies to this contract. The goal will be no less than nine percent (9%) of the agreement value. Within the letter-of-interest submittal, you must include the designated certified DBE sub-consultant(s) which you plan to use. To be eligible for DBE credit, the sub-consultant(s) must be currently certified by the Department. If the prime consultant is a Connecticut certified DBE firm, they will satisfy the DBE requirement provided their percentage of work performed meets the assigned goal.

Prior to the negotiation process, the selected firm will be required to have a Department-approved audit and affirmative action plan, as well as current corporate registration with the Secretary of State (partnerships excluded). The selected firm will also be required to maintain insurance coverage from a firm approved to do business in the State of Connecticut. A minimum of two million dollars (\$2,000,000) Professional Liability Insurance coverage, with a maximum deductible of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), will be required. Proof of coverage must be submitted on acceptable insurance forms prior to the start of the negotiations process.

Do not send additional documentation other than what is requested. The Consultant Selection Panel may reject your submittal, and your firm may not be considered for this project if you provide additional documentation such as corporate brochures, background information, and histories.

In accordance with the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS) Sections 4-252, 4a-81, and 4-252a, firms, once selected, must complete the Office of Policy and Management's (OPM) Ethics Form 1 (Gift and Campaign Contribution Certification), Form 5 (Consulting Agreement Affidavit), and Form 7 (Iran Certification) prior to the agreement/contract execution. Forms 1 and 5 apply to all consulting agreements/contracts which have a total value to the State of Connecticut (State) of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or more in a calendar or fiscal year. Form 7 applies to any consulting agreement/contract which has a total cumulative value to the State of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or more. Any consultant that does not complete the certifications (Form 1 & 7) required under subsection (c) of CGS 4-252 and subsection (b) of CGS 4-252a, or refuses to submit the affidavit (Form 5) required under subsection (b) of CGS 4a-81 shall be disqualified and the Department shall award the agreement/contract to the next highest ranked consultant or seek new submittals, in accordance with subsection (d) of CGS 4-252 and subsection (d) of CGS 4a-81. Please note, in an effort to streamline the certification and affidavit process for contract/agreement execution, the Department is requiring selected firms to upload Forms 1 and 5 on the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) Business Network ("BizNet") website.
