**Minutes**

**Prior to Presentation:** Color plans were displayed for the 6:30 p.m. informal question and answer session prior to the 7:00 p.m. formal Public Informational Meeting. The meeting was attended by approximately 50 to 60 members of the public.

**Presentation:** The meeting began at 7:00 p.m. A detailed PowerPoint presentation was delivered by the Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) personnel concerning the proposed design of the Charter Oak Greenway shared use path (path) in the Town of Manchester and Bolton.

The presentation covered the following:

- ⇒ Purpose, need and benefits of project
- ⇒ Existing conditions
- ⇒ Proposed path alignment was presented including: construction of pedestrian bridges over Camp Meeting Road (west of Birch Mountain Road and Route 6/44)
- ⇒ Minor property acquisitions, slope easements and some drainage easements are anticipated
- ⇒ Ingress and egress will be maintained at all times
- ⇒ The estimated construction cost of the project is \$11.4 million, funded with 80% Federal funds and 20% State funds
- ⇒ Construction is expected to begin in summer 2014, and be completed in fall 2016

**Public Comments, Questions, and Answers:** The meeting was attended by State Senator Steve Cassano of the 4th State Senate District, Town of Manchester Mayor Leo Diana, Mr. Mark Carlino-Director of Public Works, Mr. James Mayer-Traffic Engineer and approximately 50 to 60 members of the public. There were a variety of questions regarding the proposed path alignment, parking areas, extending project limits towards Bolton Notch, maintenance of the path, path surface material, and project funding, which were answered by Department staff. State Senator Cassano, Mayor Diana and a person

representing the Mayor of Vernon spoke on the merits and benefits of bicycle trails and offered their full support of the project.

**Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

**Summary:** There were no objections to the project and the proposed path was supported by the Town and those in attendance.
