

## **DWSRF PROGRAM - EXAMPLES OF ELIGIBLE PROJECTS**

**PLANNING** -Assessments and studies leading to eligible construction projects

**DESIGN** - Engineering, surveying and architectural work leading to eventual eligible construction projects.

## **CONSTRUCTION**

### **Water Quality –**

- Source water improvements
- New treatment process
- Change type of existing treatment
- Automation
- Multiple treatment trains

### **Water Quantity –**

- Main improvements (replacement)
- Metering
- Leak detection
- Booster pumps
- New sources (development)
- Storage (tanks)

### **Upgrade Infrastructure –**

- Replace pumps, tanks, pipes, appurtenances
- Replace aging or outdated facilities
- Main replacement, relining, pigging

### **Acquire PWS –**

- Consolidation of individual water systems
- Acquisition of system

### **Source Protection -**

- Acquire easements, additional land\*, signs, postings, fencing  
(\* Only land that is integral to a project)

### **Other Projects -**

- Treatment residual disposal
- Extension of water to contaminated private wells
- Telemetry

## **STAND-BY-POWER**

## **EXAMPLES OF INELIGIBLE PROJECTS**

- Dams, or rehabilitation of dams.
- Reservoirs, except for finished reservoirs and those reservoirs that are part of the treatment process and are located on the property.
- Water rights, except if the water rights are owned by a system that is being purchased through consolidation as part of a capacity development strategy.
- Laboratory fees for monitoring.
- Operation and maintenance expenses.
- Projects mainly for fire protection.
- Projects for systems that lack adequate technical, managerial and financial capabilities, unless assistance will ensure compliance.
- Projects primarily to serve future growth.
