



Trend in HIV/AIDS, Connecticut, 1993-2008



- The graph above shows trends in People living with HIV or AIDS, reported AIDS cases, and the trend in the sum of reported AIDS and HIV (not AIDS) cases. When a case of HIV is re-reported with AIDS the case is no longer counted as HIV in the year in which it was originally reported.
- The trend in HIV and AIDS reflects the reporting of a large number of HIV cases that had not been previously reported because they were initially diagnosed when HIV (not AIDS) was not a reportable condition (prior to 2002). In 2002 HIV was made reportable with a code option instead of patient name and in 2005 all HIV cases were reportable by name. In 2006 HIV viral load was made reportable resulting in the reporting of all persons receiving viral load tests. Click [here](#) for additional data about viral load reporting.
