

HIV continuum of care, Connecticut, 2010.



12,565 HIV-infected people are living in Connecticut based on the CDC estimate that 20% of people who have HIV infection are unaware of their HIV positive status.

- 10,052 people were diagnosed with HIV infection that were ≥ 13 years of age at the end of 2009, were living at the end of 2010, and residing in Connecticut.
- Estimates of entry into care and the number of care visits are based on reports of low CD4 (< 200 CD4+ T cells/ml or $< 14\%$) and HIV viral load during 2010 (CD4 and HIV viral load tests are most likely ordered by HIV care providers).
- Viral suppression is defined as ≤ 200 copies/ml.
- Of the PLWH who have at least one visit during 2010, 82% have a second visit at least three months later, and 76% have viral suppression.
