

Trend in deaths among people infected with HIV,
Connecticut, 1999-2006.



- In Connecticut, deaths are reported to the Department of Public Health (DPH). The DPH Vital Records Section monitors causes of death and routinely reports the number of deaths with HIV as the underlying (primary) cause (gray bars in graph above). The DPH HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program matches death data to the HIV/AIDS registry to identify deaths from all causes (black bars). Included are deaths due to HIV as an underlying cause; deaths due to HIV as a related (contributory) cause; and, deaths unrelated to HIV infection. DPH uses these data to determine the number of people living with HIV/AIDS in Connecticut. In 2006, 224 people with HIV infection died, 126 (56.3%) with HIV as the underlying cause.
