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
Re: Joint Investigation by DPH and PURA Regarding Indian Fields Homeowner's Association's Request To Cease Operations as a Water Company, Docket Number 13-02-04

ORDER

At the hearing on April 11, 2013, the Department of Public Health ("DPH") and the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection's Public Utilities Regulatory Authority ("PURA") (collectively, "the Departments") ordered the Indian Fields Homeowners Association ("Indian Fields") and the Aquarion Water Company of Connecticut ("Aquarion") to submit to the Departments on or before April 25, 2013 four late filed exhibits, including Late Filed Exhibit 4 that required clarification of the well locations, including the numbering of the wells, and the rights being transferred to Aquarion with respect to each well, including the easements being conveyed or assigned and the rights being transferred with respect to each of the easements.

On April 23, 2013, the Departments received Indian Fields and Aquarion's responses to the late filed exhibits. With respect to Late Filed Exhibit 4, however, Indian Fields and Aquarion did not provide copies of the easements being conveyed and assigned, nor the rights being transferred with respect to each of the easements. Accordingly, Indian Fields and Aquarion are hereby **ORDERED** to provide **on or before May 13, 2013** copies of the easements being conveyed and assigned, including any maps referenced in such easements, and the rights being transferred with respect to each of the easements.

The Departments require an original and two (2) copies of all submissions, including cover letters. All parties are required to serve each other with a copy of all documents submitted to the Departments.
