The Department of Public Health Drinking Water Section (DWS) has received your letter as Chairman of the Upper CT River Water Utility Coordinating Committee recommending approval of a new public water system located at Worthington Pond Farms in Somers, CT. We understand that this recommendation is subject to DWS and Department of Utility Control (DPUC) approvals. Worthington Pond Farms will be a Transient Non-community system, and as such the development of this well is not subject to DPUC review and approval. On July 21, 2008, DWS issued the Phase I-A approval for the well site. Worthington Pond Farms is still required to obtain Phase I-B and Phase II approvals prior to final DWS approval of the new water system.

We have received a screening application filed by Worthington Pond Farm for the creation of a new non-community water system. The Connecticut Department of Public Health, Water Supplies Section has requested the Upper Ct. WUCC to review the application and send its recommendation. Unfortunately the next meeting of the Upper Ct. WUCC is April 7, 2009. However in January 2005 the Upper Ct. WUCC approved an administrative process for the approval of new non-community public water systems. Therefore I chose a subgroup of the WUCC consisting of Jonathan Avery from Hazardville Water Company, Steve Pratt of Hartford MDC and Jack Keefe of the Connecticut Water Company to vote on this application. The property in question is in Hazardville Water Company's exclusive service area. The Ct. Water Co. is the only other ESA holder proximate to the site. Mr. Avery agrees to recommend approval of Worthington Pond Farm's request but emailed the following: "As stated in a prior message, we would like to operate this new system but not own it since the health Dept didn't get us involved at an early stage where we could have the system set up with our specifications. It is in our exclusive service area so we would have a contract agreement with the owner and they would be responsible for financially maintaining the system." Both Mr. Pratt and Mr. Keefe concur with this. Naturally this is subject to approval by the Connecticut Department of Public Health, Water Supplies Section and the Department of Public Utility Control. Please send me a copy of your final decision by April 7, 2009 so I may report it to the Upper CT. WUCC.




Map
