Enclosed is a copy of the "Annual Report on the Water Utility Coordinating Committee (WUCC) Planning Process for Public Water Systems" as required by Connecticut General Statute (CGS) Section 25-33n and amended by Public Act 94-219. This report summarizes the current status of the Connecticut Plan process for public water systems as overseen by the Department of Public Health (DPH). The Connecticut Plan process is intended to protect public health and ensure adequate water supply to all of CT's residents through the coordination of regional public drinking water supply.

DPH oversees the implementation of the Water Utility Coordinating Committee process pursuant to Connecticut General Statute (CGS) Section 25-33(c) through (j). The process coordinates the planning of regional water supply and has seven (7) designated regional Water Utility Coordinating Committees (WUCC's) which are tasked with preparing regional coordinated water supply plans and assisting in the resolution of regional water supply issues that often cross municipal borders.

DPH is also the lead agency for the review of Water Supply Plans pursuant to (CGS) Section 25-32d. The process includes preparation of individual water supply plans by the eighty-four (84) largest public water suppliers in CT and including a summary of necessary system improvements for the five, twenty, and fifty year planning periods.

Legislative proposals for changes to the current planning process were submitted in this year's legislative session so this report has been updated with information through December 31, 2008 on all aspects of the Connecticut Plan process to assist in providing the most up to date and accurate information to your members. The statutory requirement for this report would have been to provide updated information only through June 30, 2008 but DPH has made several significant improvements to the process since that time that merit the attention of your members.

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
