

Subsurface Sewage Disposal System **CLEANER Exam Information**

- Exam applications must be completed and submitted to the Department of Public Health (DPH) by their respective due dates.
- Exam offered 4 times a year (quarterly) at DPH building in Hartford, CT.
- Exam time allowed is 2 hours; passing grade is 80 or higher.
- Exam consists of 25 true/false questions.
