The top 5 finalists will be notified by Wednesday, May 2, 2012 that they are a finalist for the top prize and their entries will be exhibited from Thursday, May 3 to Friday, May 11, 2012, in the “Child Labor Through the Years” exhibit in the Capitol/LOB Concourse in Hartford.

The top prize of \$500 will be awarded on Friday, May 11, at 12 noon in the Concourse and its image will be featured on the Connecticut Young Worker Health and Safety Team fact sheet. The creator(s) name(s) and school will be included with the logo.
