

What does workplace health and safety mean to you?

The Connecticut Young Worker Health and Safety Team is pleased to announce a statewide contest for teens to create artwork that demonstrates health and safety practices that can help teens and other workers avoid hazards in their workplaces. The submitted artwork may include the following: graphic design, photography, montage, drawing and/or painting.

Eligible students must be enrolled in a Connecticut comprehensive high school, technical high school or home schooled in order to participate. Artwork entry must be submitted on unfolded, standard white paper sized 8 ½" by 11" by October 15, 2014.

Team members will judge each submission based on the following criteria: safety message, content, design and creativity. Each of the winners will receive a monetary prize and will have his/her artwork, school and name featured in a 2015 calendar to promote young worker health and safety awareness in Connecticut. Calendars will be distributed to teens, teachers, parents, employers, trades, unions and other health and safety professionals.
