



## The Connecticut Hoarding Working Group

The Connecticut Hoarding Working Group began meeting in Newington during September of 2014 after recognizing the long-standing, evident need for a more advanced and multidisciplinary discussion of the often-taboo subject of hoarding. Group membership has since grown to nearly 300 members, representing more than 70 municipalities and a diverse assortment of professional disciplines.

The Working Group has also made a great deal of progress in this time. Under the edifice of four unique sub-committees, members have begun to explore best practices for responding to cases of hoarding, developed and disseminated valuable resources to individuals and agencies impacted by the issue, worked to secure legislative support and backing for the group's efforts, and organized an exciting and informative May 4, 2015 conference.

The Working Group hopes to continue meeting regularly going forward, so as to continue facilitating strong working relationships among individuals dedicated to achieving more positive outcomes for everyone involved in addressing these often difficult and complex situations.

## EFFECTS ON THE FAMILY

- *Loss of Usable Living Space* (e.g. kitchen, living room, etc.). Families are often unable to use their kitchens to cook food and may, therefore, be dependent on ordering take-out daily. This may lead to more financial strain and obesity.
- *Financial Strain* results from excessive shopping and the need to get more storage facilities (chests, lockers, garages, sheds, etc.)
- *Fire Hazards*: Paths may be blocked to exit the home or to access a fire extinguisher during a fire emergency; hoarded materials can increase the fire load, can interfere with firefighters being able to save the people from the home, etc
- *Other Safety Hazards*: mildew, fungus, accumulated dust, structural damage, hygiene issues, nonworking heat or electricity, pest infestation, etc. In addition, emergency personnel may not be able to enter the home if necessary if egress is blocked.
- *Interpersonal Conflicts*: family members may express upset and disapproval of the clutter, leading to resentment or arguments

## EFFECTS ON THE CHILDREN OF HOARDERS

- Depression
- Isolation
- Embarrassment
- Social Competence Deficits

Children are often too embarrassed to have friends come over, or are not allowed to, due to their parent's embarrassment. This may lead to isolation, helplessness, and resentment.

When a child has social competence deficits this can often lead to short-term, intermediate, and long-term difficulties in domains of educational, psychosocial, and vocational functioning.



## EFFECTS ON THE ADULT CHILDREN OF HOARDERS

- Adult children often copy or oppose the behavior that they witnessed as a child. Either hoarding behaviors may be learned and repeated, despite living separately, or the adult child, embarrassed and disgusted at how they lived, may keep next to nothing.
- As children of hoarders grow older, they may have a strained relationship with the hoarding parent(s) by:
  - Becoming estranged from their hoarding relative due to disagreements about how hoarding should be handled.
  - Blaming their parents for the conditions they lived in as a child.
  - Resistant to bring their own children to the grandparents' home – behavior may be seen as a bad influence.



# TIP SHEET...DOS & DON'TS

*How To Engage A Defensive Hoarder*

Treat the client with DIGNITY and RESPECT.<sup>1</sup>

CREAT TRUST by building RAPPORT with the client.<sup>2</sup>

During the assessment...  
RECOGNIZE your client's STRENGTHS.<sup>3</sup>

DON'T jeopardize your SAFETY!  
Be aware of your surroundings.<sup>7</sup>

NO CLEANUP TAKEOVER!  
Include the client.  
He/she must play an active role in the process of change.<sup>10</sup>

Don't appear SHOCKED or show NEGATIVE facial expressions when engaging.<sup>8</sup>

ALLOW the client to decide WHAT or HOW to rid of their POSSESSIONS.<sup>9</sup>

REALIZE that the client has placed VALUE on his/her BELONGINGS. Give the client TIME to INITIATE CHANGE.<sup>4</sup>

REALIZE that no one FACTOR/CONDITION is the sole CAUSE of hoarding.<sup>6</sup>

INCLUDE CLOSE FAMILY!  
It may be in the best interest of the client to include those CLOSEST to them in the process of change.<sup>5</sup>

Have PATIENCE and COMPASSION...  
Disposal of possessions may cause more EMOTIONAL distress.<sup>11</sup>

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## HOARDING DISORDER TIP SHEET

Hoarding disorder is a prevalent and potentially dangerous issue that needs to be addressed so that we can help to avoid fatalities and unsafe living conditions, as well as to promote healthy minds and bodies.

The following tips are directed towards those working with individuals with Hoarding Disorder.

- ❖ The Saving Inventory is a questionnaire that can be used to assess severity of hoarding
- ❖ Wait to enter the home until deemed safe – do not risk your life
- ❖ Cognitive Behavior Therapy may be helpful in treating the individual. It is skills-based and tends to focus on skills for reducing acquiring, increasing de-cluttering, problem-solving, and organizing.
- ❖ Symptoms may be paired with procrastination, a lack of organization, and poor decision making that may result in the impairment of typical functioning
- ❖ Be empathetic and understanding
- ❖ Patience is key – results may take time
- ❖ Stress that you are not trying to take control away, but rather take small steps to make things better
- ❖ Do not overwhelm the individual – break down into several sessions
- ❖ Consistently follow up with the individual to ensure they are maintaining healthy patterns
- ❖ Reference NASW Code of Ethics as well as Competencies

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# NEUROBIOLOGICAL ASPECTS OF HOARDING

The brain plays an important role in establishing a better understanding of individuals who suffer from hoarding disorders. Although research is still in its infancy, several studies have examined the relationship between hoarding and brain activity.

## Decision Making & Brain Function

- Individuals with hoarding disorder take longer to make decisions regarding discarding their possessions than individuals without hoarding disorder.
- When presented with the task of making decisions of what to do with their possessions, individuals often experience extreme anxiety, indecisiveness, anger, and/or sadness.
- When those who exhibit hoarding behaviors were presented with making decisions in regards to items that did not belong to them, there was less brain activity within the anterior cingulate cortex and the insula, suggesting that overactivation of these areas is associated with personal possessions only.
- Research indicates that while making decisions about whether to discard possessions, individuals with hoarding have greater brain activity within the anterior cingulate cortex and the insula, as compared with individuals who do not exhibit hoarding behaviors.
- The anterior cingulate cortex within the brain is one of the cortical areas responsible for controlling the decision-making processes; the insula within the brain is responsible for controlling emotions.
- Research indicates a link between the strong emotional aspects of the decision making process for those who exhibit hoarding behaviors when it pertains to their possessions.

## Memory

- Individuals with hoarding behaviors reported less confidence in memory and a greater deal of worry associated with potential for forgetting.
- Research indicates that individuals with hoarding behaviors display greater amounts of activity in the left parahippocampal gyrus, which is partly responsible for controlling effortful memory, search & retrieval.
- Research also indicates that individuals with hoarding behaviors show less activity of the superior frontal gyrus, which is associated with working memory.

## Mental Health

- Individuals with hoarding behaviors tend to have a high rate of comorbid mental health disorders, such as social phobia and depression.
- Research indicates that individuals with hoarding behaviors often report past trauma such as violence, failed relationship, death, physical or sexual abuse, etc., although many individuals without a history of trauma also develop hoarding disorder.
- Hoarding behavior is strongly linked to anxiety; research indicates that individuals experience a greater activation in the left precentral gyrus (sensorimotor cortex) of the brain when presented with the task or idea of disposing of their items. The left precentral gyrus of the brain is associated with anxiety.

## Brain Damage and Dementia

- Research has indicated that damage to the brain can cause an individual to develop hoarding behaviors
- Damage to the anterior ventromedial prefrontal cortex region of the brain has been associated with the onset of hoarding behaviors within individuals who had no hoarding behaviors prior to the damage. Damage to the mesial frontal region has also been associated with the onset of hoarding behaviors.
- Neuroimaging evidence has discovered that individuals with the frontal variant of frontotemporal dementia tend to exhibit hoarding behaviors
- Research has indicated a correlation between pathological hoarding behavior and Alzheimer's dementia

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# The Clutter Image Rating Scale

*The Clutter Image Rating Scale (CIR)* is a pictorial measure of clutter severity containing nine photographs depicting increasing levels of clutter. CIR scores can range from 1 to 9, with picture 1 indicating an absence of clutter and 9 indicative of the highest level of clutter. The hoarding individual is typically requested to make one rating for each room of the home.

The CIR has good psychometric properties, including strong convergent validity (i.e., it is highly correlated with other measures of hoarding severity). The CIR is commonly used in treatment outcome research on hoarding disorder. Research has suggested that self-report of clutter severity on the CIR is well-correlated with ratings made by independent individuals or clinicians visiting the home.

The scale is sensitive to treatment effects and therefore can be used to assess response to intervention, or simply change in clutter over time. Patients receiving a full course of Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy for hoarding disorder (lasting 16-26 sessions) tend to show an average decrease of around 1-3 points on this scale, when scores from all rooms are averaged together.

The scale is also excellent to use when home visits cannot be conducted but the assessor desires an estimate of the level of clutter within the home.

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

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# **Public Health & Safety Considerations**

**Hoarding may progress to the point that it becomes a public health issue because it has the potential to:**

- Provide a favorable habitat for rodents and insects.
- Become a safety hazard to the general public (e.g., fire hazard).
- Become a safety hazard to the occupant or visitors (e.g., tripping, falling items, electrocution, fire).
- Be a sign of mental illness (e.g., obsessive compulsive disorder).
- Create a risk of zoonotic disease when animal hoarding is involved.
- Create issues concerning the appropriate disposal of large quantities of hoarded material.

**Potential health concerns for occupants, nearby residents & first responders:**

- Fire hazards from extreme clutter, decaying or damaged electrical wiring.
- Blockage of exits from dwelling.
- Lack of running water and electricity.
- Burst pipes.
- No heat.
- Infestation from rodents and/or insects.
- Heavy accumulations of feces and urine can damage dwellings beyond repair creating an unsafe structural situation.
- Poor air quality may require first responders to wear respiratory protection to prevent inhaling mold spores and toxic gasses like ammonia during response efforts.
- Potentially toxic gases and mold can be released into the air creating odor problems for neighbors. Odors are associated with the accumulations of waste from dead animals or inadequate waste disposal.
- Social isolation and co-occurring psychological disorders cause hoarders to refuse treatment until there is a medical emergency or interventions by public agencies for code violations.

**Anyone entering a cluttered dwelling should utilize the following items for personal protection:**

- N95 mask (at a minimum)
- Goggles
- Coverall's
- Shoe covers
- Insect repellent
- Gloves
- Disposable moist towels
- Drinking water
- Flashlight

# **Volunteer Guidelines**

Hoarding can create an unsafe and unhealthy living environment. These conditions can lead to health issues, physical injury, falls, fire, and other potential life threatening problems. An understanding, patient team of volunteers can transform a home with hoarding conditions into a safer & healthier environment. If the individual with hoarding tendencies continues to live in the home, attention by a Human/Social Services staff in conjunction with ongoing periodic volunteer visits is essential to preventing the home from returning to an unlivable state.

## ***Confidentiality***

Confidentiality must be respected and maintained at all times. Do not discuss your client's situation either specifically or generically. Do not discuss personal, medical, or financial issues that you may encounter. Do not share names or addresses of people you have worked with. Do not even describe the situation as even without names someone may be identified by the description of their situation.

## ***Consider & Respect Boundaries***

- Never accept money or gifts of intrinsic value. Some people may wish to give you something out of gratitude for your assistance, from a sense of obligation, or because they feel insecure about the relationship and they want to guarantee your return. Accepting gifts changes the basis of the relationship. It can also create problems with your client's family and perceptions of exploitation.
- It is recommended that you do not give out your phone number or address. A client in need may wish to call every day, even several times a day.
- Do not use your role as a volunteer to proselytize your own personal religious persuasion. Avoid the word "should", giving advice, which may no more than your opinion, can be dangerous.
- Do not discuss your problems with your client. You are there to uplift his or her spirits. It is fine to share light, casual things about yourself and your life.
- Do not dispense any prescription medication of any kind, including aspirin and over the counter medicines. Do not advise about medicines or medical conditions.

## ***Volunteer Safety***

- Do not lift or carry anything heavier than you are capable of. Do not provide personal care (i.e. bathing, toileting, dressing) for the client.
- Recognize your own physical limitations and do not attempt to do anything beyond your capabilities.
- Do not assist with client's finances (e.g. making out checks, balancing the checkbook, filling out application forms for benefits or services, etc.) You can become vulnerable to accusations of theft or misuse of funds.
- If you suspect that your client has financial troubles and is unable to afford basic living necessities, a referral to town human/social services may be appropriate.

## ***Occupant & Volunteer Safety Considerations***

- Be prepared for emergencies. Call 911 for any & all emergencies.
- If you identify an issue of concern that is not an emergency, discuss it with your volunteer coordinator and/or town social worker(s).

- Ask the client if they could refrain from smoking while you are there and thank him/her.
- Ask the client to restrain dogs that may perceive you (the volunteer) as a threat to the client.
- Bring hand sanitizer and wash your hands once you return to your vehicle. Change your shoes if necessary.

### ***Occupant Safety Considerations***

- Do not meet with your client if you are not feeling well. Your client may be older, frail or weak, and may simply not be in overall good health. A common cold for you could be much more serious for a frail person.
- Do not smoke while you are with or working for your client.
- Use universal precautions whenever you handle any food items, use the bathroom facility, and or help with light housecleaning. Wash your hands often.
- Volunteers can screen for potential causes of accidents in their client's home & tactfully suggest ways to make the living environment safer and more secure.

### ***Hazardous Conditions in the Home***

- Some older people or those with limited financial resources may stop updating appliances and equipment in their home.
- They may use lower watt bulbs in an effort to save money or be unable to climb to change burned out bulbs.
- They may use extension cords because their homes may not have adequate outlets for lamps and appliances. The use of extension cords poses dual threats from falling & possible fire.
- Be alert to use of candles which may pose a fire threat especially if the electricity has been turned off. Contact appropriate agency to notify of hazard. It may be possible to get electricity turned back on.

### ***Making the Home Safer***

*(Volunteer may make additional suggestions as appropriate)*

- Remove things from stairs and from walking area (i.e. papers, books, clothes, or shoes)
- Arrange furniture and other objects so they do not interfere with walking area
- Keep frequently used items in lower cabinets so they do not need to use a step stool as often
- Have grab bars installed for toilet, tub, & shower
- Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on the shower floors
- Improve the lighting, be aware of glare
- Have handrails and lights on all staircases
- Secure any area rugs with double-face tape
- Consider suggesting a lifeline
- Place electrical cords and telephone wires away from walking paths - do not bury them under rugs or layers of belongings
- Install smoke and CO detectors in the home and test and change the batteries frequently

# **FIRE MARSHAL**

- **CT General Statute 29-306(a) – Fire Marshal’s abatement of fire hazards**
  - Applies at *any* premises with:
    - *combustible or explosive matter, dangerous accumulation of rubbish or any flammable material especially liable to fire, that is so situated as to endanger life or property,*
    - *obstructions or conditions that present a fire hazard to the occupants or interfere with their egress in case of fire,*
- **29-306(b) Notification, Referral and Civil Actions**
  - (b) requires the LFM notify the prosecuting attorney if the owner or occupant fail to abate a hazard as reasonably ordered by the LFM.
  - (b) further requires the SFM be notified of the referral to the prosecutor.
  - (b) allows civil injunction to close or restrict use
  - (c) allows a local fire marshal or police officer to order any building vacated, where such person determines that there exists in the building a *risk of death or injury* from one or more of the *enumerated violations* known as the “five deadly sins”, which include:
- **CGS 29-306(c) “Five Deadly Sins”**
  - *Blocked, insufficient or impeded egress*
  - Required fire protection or warning system shut off or maintenance failure
  - Unpermitted flammable or explosive material or in excess of permitted quantities
  - Unpermitted fireworks or pyrotechnics
  - Exceeding occupancy limit established by FM
- **CGS 29-306(c) Notice to State Fire Marshal**
  - If imminent egress hazards cannot be corrected within FOUR HOURS, this statute and the SFM Directive #10 requires notification to the State Fire Marshal who reviews the circumstances and may either uphold, modify or reverse the vacate order.

## **Criminal Fire Hazard Penalties**

- **CGS 29-306(a) :**
  - \$100 fine and/ or three months jail
- **CGS 29-306(c) :**
  - \$1000 find and/or six months jail

**NOTE: CRIMINAL PENALTIES MAY ONLY BE IMPOSED BY A JUDGE AFTER A FINDING OF GUILTY**

**Statute: Conn Gen. Stat. § 29-306. Abatement of fire hazards: Order to remove or remedy; penalties; notification of officials; order to vacate; review by State Fire Marshal**

(a) When the local fire marshal ascertains that there exists in any building, or upon any premises, (1) combustible or explosive matter, dangerous accumulation of rubbish or any flammable material especially liable to fire, that is so situated as to endanger life or property, (2) obstructions or conditions that present a fire hazard to the occupants or interfere with their egress in

case of fire, or (3) a condition in violation of the statutes relating to fire prevention or safety, or any regulation made pursuant thereto, the remedy of which requires construction or a change in structure, the local fire marshal shall order such materials to be immediately removed or the conditions remedied by the owner or occupant of such building or premises. Any such removal or remedy shall be in conformance with all building codes, ordinances, rules and regulations of the municipality involved. Any person, firm or corporation which violates any provision of this subsection shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars or be imprisoned not more than three months, or both, and, in addition, may be fined fifty dollars a day for each day's continuance of each violation, to be recovered in a proper action in the name of the state.

(b) Upon failure of an owner or occupant to abate a hazard or remedy a condition pursuant to subsection (a) of this section within a reasonable period of time as specified by the local fire marshal, such local fire marshal shall promptly notify in writing the prosecuting attorney having jurisdiction in the municipality in which such hazard exists of all the facts pertaining thereto, and such official shall promptly take such action as the facts may require, and a copy of such notification shall be forwarded promptly to the State Fire Marshal. The local fire marshal may request the chief executive officer or any official of the municipality authorized to institute actions on behalf of the municipality in which the hazard exists, or the State Fire Marshal, for the purpose of closing or restricting from public service or use such place or premises until such hazard has been remedied, to apply to any court of equitable jurisdiction for an injunction against such owner or occupant; or the State Fire Marshal, on his own initiative, may apply to such court for such injunction. When such hazard is found to exist upon premises supervised or licensed by a state department or agency, the State Fire Marshal shall promptly notify the administrator of such department or agency of his findings and shall issue orders for the elimination of such hazard.

(c) If the local fire marshal or a local police officer determines that there exists in a building a risk of death or injury from (1) blocked, insufficient or impeded egress, (2) failure to maintain or the shutting off of any fire protection or fire warning system required by the Fire Safety Code<sup>1</sup> or State Fire Prevention Code,<sup>2</sup> (3) the storage of any flammable or explosive material without a permit or in quantities in excess of any allowable limits pursuant to a permit, (4) the use of any firework or pyrotechnic device without a permit, or (5) exceeding the occupancy limit established by the State Fire Marshal or a local fire marshal, such fire marshal or police officer may issue a verbal or written order to immediately vacate the building. Such fire marshal or police officer shall notify or submit a copy of such order to the State Fire Marshal if such marshal or officer anticipates that any of the conditions specified in subdivisions (1) to (5), inclusive, of this subsection cannot be abated in four hours or less from the time of such order. Upon receipt of any such notification or copy, the State Fire Marshal shall review such order to vacate, and after consultation with the local fire marshal or local police officer, determine whether to uphold, modify or reverse such order, with any further conditions the State Fire Marshal deems appropriate to protect any person from injury. A violation of such order shall be subject to the penalties under section 29-295.

## **HEALTH**

**§ 19a-206. Duties of municipal directors of health. Nuisances and sources of filth. Injunctions. Civil penalties. Authority of town director within city or borough. Availability of relocation assistance**

(a) Town, city and borough directors of health or their authorized agents shall, within their respective jurisdictions, examine all nuisances and sources of filth injurious to the public health, cause such nuisances to be abated or remediated and cause to be removed all filth which in their judgment may endanger the health of the inhabitants. Any owner or occupant of any property who maintains such property, whether real or personal, or any part thereof, in a manner which violates the provisions of the Public Health Code enacted pursuant to the authority of sections 19a-36 and 19a-37 shall be deemed to be maintaining a nuisance or source of filth injurious to the public health. Any local director of health or his authorized agent or a sanitarian authorized by such director may enter all places within his jurisdiction where there is just cause to suspect any nuisance or source of filth exists, and abate or remediate or cause to be abated or remediated such nuisance and remove or cause to be removed such filth.

(b) When any such nuisance or source of filth is found on private property, such director of health shall order the owner or occupant of such property, or both, to remove, abate or remediate the same within such time as the director directs. If the owner of such property is a registrant, such director may deliver the order in accordance with section 7-148ii, provided nothing in this section shall preclude a director from providing notice in another manner permitted by applicable law. If such order is not complied with within the time fixed by such director: (1) Such director, or any official of such town, city or borough authorized to institute actions on behalf of such town, city or borough, may institute and maintain a civil action for injunctive relief in any court of competent jurisdiction to require the abatement or remediation of such nuisance, the removal of such filth and the restraining and prohibiting of acts which caused such nuisance or filth, and such court shall have power to grant such injunctive relief upon notice and hearing; (2) (A) the owner or occupant of such property, or both, shall be subject to a civil penalty of two hundred fifty dollars per day for each day such nuisance is maintained or such filth is allowed to remain after the time fixed by the director in his order has expired, except that the owner or occupant of such property or any part thereof on which a public eating place is conducted shall not be subject to the provisions of this subdivision, but shall be subject to the provisions of subdivision (3) of this subsection, and (B) such civil penalty may be collected in a civil proceeding by the director of health or any official of such town, city or borough authorized to institute civil actions and shall be payable to the treasurer of such city, town or borough; and (3) the owner or occupant of such property, or both, shall be subject to the provisions of sections 19a-36, 19a-220 and 19a-230.

(c) If the director institutes an action for injunctive relief seeking the abatement or remediation of a nuisance or the removal of filth, the maintenance of which is of so serious a nature as to constitute an immediate hazard to the health of persons other than the persons maintaining such nuisance or filth, he may, upon a verified complaint stating the facts which show such immediate hazard, apply for an ex parte injunction requiring the abatement or remediation of such nuisance or the removal of such filth and restraining and prohibiting the acts which caused such nuisance or filth to occur, and for a hearing on an order to show cause why such ex parte injunction should not be continued pending final determination on the merits of such action. If the court finds that an

immediate hazard to the health of persons other than those persons maintaining such nuisance or source of filth exists, such ex parte injunction shall be issued, provided a hearing on its continuance pending final judgment is ordered held within seven days thereafter and provided further that any persons so enjoined may make a written request to the court or judge issuing such injunction for a hearing to vacate such injunction, in which event such hearing shall be held within three days after such request is filed.

(d) In each town, except in a town having a city or borough within its limits, the town director of health shall have and exercise all the power for preserving the public health and preventing the spread of diseases; and, in any town within which there exists a city or borough, the limits of which are not coterminous with the limits of such town, such town director of health shall exercise the powers and duties of his office only in such part of such town as is outside the limits of such city or borough, except that when such city or borough has not appointed a director of health, the town director of health shall, for the purposes of this section, exercise the powers and duties of his office throughout the town, including such city or borough, until such city or borough appoints a director of health.

(e) When such nuisance is abated or remediated or the source of filth is removed from private property, such abatement, remediation or removal shall be at the expense of the owner or, where applicable, the occupant of such property, or both, and damages and costs for such abatement, remediation or removal may be recovered against the owner or, where applicable, the occupant, or both, by the town, city or borough in a civil action as provided in subsection (b) of this section or in a separate civil action brought by the director of health or any official of such city, town or borough authorized to institute civil actions.

(f) If the order of a district department of health, formed pursuant to section 19a-241, causes the displacement of any occupant of a residential dwelling unit, the municipality in which such dwelling unit is located shall be responsible for any relocation assistance afforded to such occupant pursuant to chapter 135.<sup>1</sup> The district department of health shall provide written notification to the occupant of the occupant's rights under chapter 135 at the time an order causing displacement is issued. The written notification shall include the name, address and telephone number of the person authorized by the municipality to process applications for relocation assistance afforded pursuant to chapter 135.

**Regs. Conn. State Agencies § 19-13-B1**

**Sec. 19-13-B1. Conditions specifically declared to constitute public nuisances**

The following conditions are specifically declared to constitute public nuisances:

(d) The discharge or exposure of sewage, garbage or any other organic filth into or on any public place in such a way that transmission of infective material may result thereby.

(g) Stagnant water likely to afford breeding places for mosquitoes within a residential district or within a distance of one thousand feet therefrom.

(i) Buildings or any part thereof which are in a dilapidated or filthy condition which may endanger the life or health of persons living in the vicinity.

**Regs. Conn. State Agencies § 19-13-B2**  
**Sec. 19-13-B2. Abatement of nuisance**

(a) Any local director of health, upon information of the existence of a nuisance or any pollution occurring within his jurisdiction, or when any such nuisance or pollution comes to his attention, shall, within a reasonable time, investigate and, upon finding such nuisance or pollution exists, shall issue his order in writing for the abatement of the same.

(b) Such order shall specify the nature of such nuisance or pollution and shall designate the time within which such abatement or discontinuance shall be accomplished; and if such order is not complied with within the time specified, the facts shall be submitted to the prosecuting authority. Copies of all orders shall be kept on file by the director of health in his office and copies of the same shall be furnished the state commissioner of health on request.

**Conn. Gen. Stat. § 19a-230. Penalty**

Any person who violates any provision of this chapter or any legal order of a director of health or board of health, for which no other penalty is provided, shall be guilty of a class C misdemeanor. *(Maximum 3 months imprisonment, \$500 fine, 1 year probation).*

# **BUILDING**

- **CGS 29-393: Right of entry**

- On receipt of information from the local fire marshal or from any other authentic source that any building in his jurisdiction, due to lack of exit facilities, fire, deterioration, catastrophe or other cause, is in such condition as to be a hazard to any person or persons, the building inspector shall immediately make an inspection by himself or by his assistant,...
- ...and may make orders for additional exit facilities or the repair or alteration of the building if the same is susceptible to repair or both or for the removal of such building or any portion thereof if any such order is necessary in the interests of public safety.

- **CT State Building Code Sec. 115: Unsafe structures and equipment**

- The BO shall deem structures or equipment an unsafe condition which are or become:
  - Unsafe
  - Insanitary
  - Deficient because of inadequate means of egress, inadequate light
  - Constitute a fire hazard
  - Or are otherwise dangerous to human life or public welfare
  - Or that involve illegal or improper occupancy or inadequate maintenance.
- The BO shall cause a report to be filed on an unsafe condition. SBC 115.2
- The unsafe structure shall be taken down and removed or made safe, as the BO deems necessary.
- A vacant structure that is not secured against entry shall be deemed unsafe.

- **SBC 116: Emergency measures**

- Imminent danger of failure or collapse of a building or structure or any part thereof which endangers human life, or
- Has fallen and human life is endangered by the occupation.
- BO is authorized and empowered to order and require the occupants to vacate forthwith.

## **Statutes and Code Provisions:**

### **Conn Gen. Stat § 29-393 Building Inspectors; Duties; Right of Entry**

On receipt of information from the local fire marshal or from any other authentic source that any building in his jurisdiction, due to lack of exit facilities, fire, deterioration, catastrophe or other cause, is in such condition as to be a hazard to any person or persons, the building inspector shall immediately make an inspection by himself or by his assistant, and may make orders for additional exit facilities or the repair or alteration of the building if the same is susceptible to repair or both or for the removal of such building or any portion thereof if any such order is necessary in the interests of public safety. Any building inspector shall have the right of entry into all buildings for the performance of his duties between the hours of nine o'clock a.m. and five o'clock p.m., in the interests of public safety.

### **STATE BUILDING CODE SECTION 115 UNSAFE STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT**

**115.1 Conditions.** Structures or existing equipment that are or hereafter become unsafe, insanitary

or deficient because of inadequate means of egress facilities, inadequate light and ventilation, or which constitute a fire hazard, or are otherwise dangerous to human life or the public welfare, or that involve illegal or improper occupancy or inadequate maintenance, shall be deemed an unsafe condition. Unsafe structures shall be taken down and removed or made safe, as the building official deems necessary and as provided for in this section. A vacant structure that is not secured against entry shall be deemed unsafe.

**115.2 Record.** The building official shall cause a report to be filed on an unsafe condition. The report shall state the occupancy of the structure and the nature of the unsafe condition.

**115.3 Notice.** If an unsafe condition is found, the building official shall serve on the owner, agent or person in control of the structure, a written notice that describes the condition deemed unsafe and specifies the required repairs or improvements to be made to abate the unsafe condition, or that requires the unsafe structure to be demolished within a stipulated time. Such notice shall require the person thus notified to declare immediately to the building official acceptance or rejection of the terms of the order.

**115.4 Method of service.** Such notice shall be deemed properly served if a copy thereof is (a) delivered to the owner personally; (b) sent by certified or registered mail addressed to the owner at the last known address with the return receipt requested; or (c) delivered in any other manner as prescribed by local law. If the certified or registered letter is returned showing that the letter was not delivered, a copy thereof shall be posted in a conspicuous place in or about the structure affected by such notice. Service of such notice in the foregoing manner upon the owner's agent or upon the person responsible for the structure shall constitute service of notice upon the owner.

**115.5 Restoration.** The structure or equipment determined to be unsafe by the building official is permitted to be restored to a safe condition. To the extent that repairs, alterations or additions are made or a change of occupancy occurs during the restoration of the structure, such repairs, alterations, additions or change of occupancy shall comply with the requirements of Section 105.2.2 and Chapter 34.

**15.6 Unsafe equipment.** Equipment deemed unsafe by the building official or his authorized representative shall not be operated after the date stated in the notice unless the required repairs or changes have been made and the equipment has been approved, or unless an extension of time has been secured from the building official or his authorized representative in writing.

**115.6.1 Authority to seal equipment.** In the case of emergency, the building official or his authorized representative shall have the authority to seal out of service immediately any unsafe device or equipment regulated by this code.

**115.6.2 Unlawful to remove seal.** Any device or equipment sealed out of service by the building official or his authorized representative shall be plainly identified as out of service by such official and shall indicate the reason for such sealing. The identification shall not be tampered with, defaced or removed except by the building official or his authorized representative.

**115.7 Penalty.** Pursuant to the provisions of section 29-394 of the Connecticut General Statutes, any person who, by himself or his agent, fails to comply with the written order of a building inspector, or the mayor of a city, the warden of a borough or the first selectman of a town not having a building inspector, for the provision of additional exit facilities in a building, the repair or alteration of a building or the removal of a building or any portion thereof, shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than six months.

## **STATE BUILDING CODE SECTION 116 – EMERGENCY MEASURES**

**116.1 Imminent danger.** When, in the opinion of the building official, there is imminent danger of failure or collapse of a building or structure or any part thereof which endangers human life, or when any building or structure or part thereof has fallen and human life is endangered by the occupation of the building or structure, the building official is hereby authorized and empowered to order and require the occupants to vacate the same forthwith. The building official shall post, or cause to be posted at each entrance to such building or structure a notice reading as follows: "This structure is unsafe and its occupancy has been prohibited by the building official." It shall be unlawful for any person to enter such premises except upon permission granted by the building official for the purposes of making the required repairs or of demolishing the premises.

**116.2 Temporary safeguards.** When, in the opinion of the building official, there is imminent danger to human life due to an unsafe condition, the building official shall cause the necessary work to be done to render such building or structure temporarily safe, whether or not the legal procedure described in Section 115 has been instituted.

**116.3 Temporary closings.** When necessary for public safety, the building official shall temporarily close buildings and structures and close, or order the authority having jurisdiction to close, sidewalks, streets, public ways and places adjacent to unsafe structures, and prohibit the same from being used.

**116.4 Emergency work.** When imminent danger or an unsafe condition requiring immediate action exists and the owner of the building or structure cannot be located, or refuses or is unable to expeditiously render the premises safe, the building official shall order the employment of the necessary labor and materials to perform the required work as expeditiously as possible. Such work shall include that required, in the building official's sole opinion, to make the premises temporarily safe, up to and including demolition.

**116.5 Costs of emergency work.** Costs incurred in the performance of emergency repairs or demolition under the order of the building official shall be paid from the treasury of the town, city or borough in which the building or structure is located on approval of the building official. The legal counsel of the town, city or borough shall institute appropriate action against the owner of the premises where the unsafe building or structure is or was located.

# **Code Enforcement and the *Uniform Relocation Assistance Act***

Connecticut's Uniform Relocation Assistance Act (Conn. Gen. Stat. Sec. 8-266 et seq.) requires that tenants who are displaced by code enforcement activities are entitled to receive assistance from the municipality or agency (such as a Health District) that ordered their displacement. Court decisions, the statute and the applicable regulations require the following assistance:

1. Temporary housing if permanent replacement housing is not immediately available.
2. The actual reasonable costs of moving and storage of property or, at the option of the tenant, payment under a schedule which is based on the number of rooms in the housing that tenant was displaced from.
3. Tenants who had resided in housing for at least 90 days at the time of displacement are also entitled rental assistance to cover the difference between their original housing and their new housing for four years. The maximum payment is \$4000 and a security deposit may be part of that payment.
4. Advisory assistance to secure permanent replacement housing.

The State Department of Housing hears appeals regarding the Uniform Relocation Assistance Act and answers questions about the Act.

# Landlord – Tenant *Considerations*

- **Tenant’s Responsibilities CGS 47a-11**

A tenant shall: (a) Comply with all obligations primarily imposed upon tenants by applicable provisions of any building, housing or fire code materially affecting health and safety; (b) keep such part of the premises that he occupies and uses as clean and safe as the condition of the premises permit; (c) remove from his dwelling unit all ashes, garbage, rubbish and other waste in a clean and safe manner to the place provided by the landlord pursuant to subdivision (5) of subsection (a) of section 47a-7; (d) keep all plumbing fixtures and appliances in the dwelling unit or used by the tenant as clean as the condition of each such fixture or appliance permits; (e) use all electrical, plumbing, sanitary, heating, ventilating, air conditioning and other facilities and appliances, including elevators, in the premises in a reasonable manner; (f) not wilfully or negligently destroy, deface, damage, impair or remove any part of the premises or permit any other person to do so; (g) conduct himself and require other persons on the premises with his consent to conduct themselves in a manner that will not disturb his neighbors’ peaceful enjoyment of the premises or constitute a nuisance, as defined in section 47a-32, or a serious nuisance, as defined in section 47a-15; and (h) if judgment has entered against a member of the tenant’s household pursuant to subsection (c) of section 47a-26h for serious nuisance by using the premises for the illegal sale of drugs, not permit such person to resume occupancy of the dwelling unit, except with the consent of the landlord.

- **When Landlord May Enter Rented Unit CGS 47a-16**

(a) A tenant shall not unreasonably withhold consent to the landlord to enter into the dwelling unit in order to inspect the premises, make necessary or agreed to repairs, alterations or improvements, supply necessary or agreed to services or exhibit the dwelling unit to prospective or actual purchasers, mortgagees, tenants, workmen or contractors.

(b) A landlord may enter the dwelling unit without consent of the tenant in case of emergency.

(c) A landlord shall not abuse the right of entry or use such right of entry to harass the tenant. The landlord shall give the tenant reasonable written or oral notice of his intent to enter and may enter only at reasonable times, except in case of emergency.

(d) A landlord may not enter the dwelling unit without the consent of the tenant except (1) in case of emergency, (2) as permitted by section 47a-16a, (3) pursuant to a court order, or (4) if the tenant has abandoned or surrendered the premises.

- **Judicial Relief if Tenant Refuses Entry CGS 47a-18**

If the tenant refuses to allow entry pursuant to section 47a-16 or section 47a-16a, the landlord may obtain a declaratory judgment or injunctive relief to compel access or terminate the rental agreement. In either case the landlord may recover actual damages and reasonable attorney's fees.

# Right of Entry and *The United States Constitution*

- **Fourth Amendment**
  - The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.
- **The Constitution of the State of Connecticut**
  - Connecticut Constitution-Article First, section 7
  - “The people shall be secure in their persons, houses, papers and possessions from unreasonable searches or seizures; And no warrant to search any place, or to seize any person or things, shall issue without describing them as nearly as may be, nor without probable cause supported by oath or affirmation.”
- In the event the official is denied access, an administrative search warrant may be applied for seeking court ordered entry.
- The warrant application Reviewed by a prosecutor prior to submittal to a judge.
- The signed warrant should be executed with the local police department to ensure there is no interference and if necessary to force entry.
- **Camara v. Municipal Court**, (1967, U.S. Supreme Court):
  - “Probable cause to issue a warrant to inspect for safety code violation ‘exists if reasonable legislative or administrative standards for conducting an area inspection are satisfied.’”

# ADA & Discrimination

- REASONABLE ACCOMMODATIONS
  - American Disabilities Act (ADA)
  - 42 USCS Section 12101.
  - Includes mental disabilities such as OCD and also other mental impairments that substantially limit one or more major life activities.
  - Individual must show they are qualified as an individual with a disability in order to claim protection under this Act.
  
- CT Law and the ADA
  - CGS 46a-77 applies the Federal ADA to all state agencies.
  - **Sec. 46a-8** defines the term "person with a disability" as any person who has a physical, mental, emotional or other disability or dysfunction which constitutes a significant obstacle to such person's ability to function normally in society.
  
- What does it mean?
  - "Reasonable accommodation" means only that a public entity must provide a disabled person with the same access to services as a non-disabled person would have.
  - Does not apply to private contractors even if fully funded by public programs.
  - Chan v. City of NY, 1 F.3d 96, 107 (1993).
  
- Discrimination in Housing CGS 47a-64b
  - Applies to any person who is mentally disabled and who is not provided reasonable accommodations.
  - May be defended if the landlord presents at least one legitimate reason for lack of accommodation, i.e. fire hazard or unsanitary conditions affecting other persons.

# ***Blight Ordinances***

## **What (Most) Blight Ordinances Entail**

Blight ordinances are determined by each individual town's governing body. Ordinances vary from town to town but typically include regulations governing the minimum standards of maintenance and condition of occupied and unoccupied premises (as defined by the ordinance) and establish safeguards for the health and safety of the occupants, community and the general public. Blight ordinances typically create enforcement procedures and delegate enforcement responsibilities.

Blight ordinances may include regulations regarding the exterior area of a property or land, i.e., overgrown vegetation, improperly stored garbage or junk, abandoned vehicles, broken windows, deteriorating walls, roof, chimney, etc. The definition of a blighted condition may vary from town to town and will be defined within each town's ordinance.

## **How a Blight Ordinance May Benefit Officials Seeking Remediation of Hoarding Cases**

Blight ordinances typically pertain only to the exteriors of properties and do not apply to the interior of a residence or other building. The Supreme Court has upheld the Bill of Right's Fourth Amendment which gives people a reasonable expectation of privacy. The Supreme Court has also upheld that home owners possess a privacy interest that extends inside their homes and in the curtilage immediately surrounding their homes. They are not afforded the same expectation of privacy to the "open field" areas of their property (i.e. what is visible from the road etc.) [See *Hester v. United States* 265 US 57 (1924)]. Furthermore, CT General Statute 8-12 provides that a Zoning Enforcement Officer's authority "to cause any building, structure, place or premises to be inspected or examined" does not extend inside private property or in the immediate vicinity of private property, such as a fenced area (curtilage). Inspection of these areas should ONLY be done with consent from the property owner or the person with a legal right to occupy the premises.

In some cases, a blight complaint may lead to the discovery of a hoarding situation if the property owner or person with a legal right to occupy the property consents to allow officials inside the premises. In the event a hoarding situation is discovered during the course of blight enforcement, the Blight/Zoning Enforcement Officer would report the condition to the proper local authority, i.e., Health Department, Fire Marshall or Building Official to allow them to make the proper determination regarding the life/safety concern.

## **How to Determine Whether Your Town Has a Blight Ordinance/Who to Contact with a Blight Complaint**

Ordinances are typically kept on file in your Town or City Clerk's office. Blight enforcement responsibilities may vary from town to town. Contact your local Town Manager's, Mayor's or First Selectman's office for more information regarding filing a blight complaint.

The Department of Children & Families has a single point of contact statewide for the reporting of suspected child abuse and neglect. **The Child Abuse and Neglect Careline** operates **24 hours a day and seven days a week**. Anyone who suspects that a child has been abused or neglected or is in danger of abuse or neglect is strongly encouraged to call the Careline at **1-800-842-2288**. DCF is required to tape record all reports to the Careline.

If information about services available in your area of the state, please call the DCF Information and Referral Services through the Careline at **1-800-842-2288**. The Information and Referral line is available from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm, Monday-Friday.

**What Information Must Be Reported?** When making a report, a reporter is required to provide the following information, if known:

- names and addresses of the child and his parents or responsible caregiver(s)
- child's age and gender
- nature and extent of injury, maltreatment or neglect
- approximate date and time the injury, maltreatment or neglect occurred
- the circumstances in which the injuries, maltreatment or neglect became known to the reporter
- previous injury, maltreatment or neglect of the child or siblings
- name of the person suspected to have caused the injury, maltreatment or neglect
- any action taken to treat or help the child
- any other information the reporter believes would be helpful

Mandated reporters are required to report or cause a report to be made when, in the ordinary course of their employment or profession, they have reasonable cause to suspect or believe that a child under the age of 18 has been abused, neglected or is placed in imminent risk of serious harm. (*Connecticut General Statutes §17a-101a*)

Child abuse occurs where a child has had physical injury inflicted upon him or her other than by accidental means, has injuries at variance with history given of them, or is in a condition resulting in maltreatment, such as, but not limited to, malnutrition, sexual molestation or exploitation, deprivation of necessities, emotional maltreatment or cruel punishment. (*Connecticut General Statutes §46b-120*)

Child neglect occurs where a child has been abandoned, is being denied proper care and attention physically, emotionally, or morally, or is being permitted to live under conditions, circumstances or associations injurious to his well-being. (*Connecticut General Statutes §46b-120*)



## ***Animal Control Considerations***

Animal Control Officers (ACOs) are governed by the Police Department or the town manager / first selectman and it varies from town to town. All ACOs are required to follow the Connecticut State Statutes regarding animals and are able to enforce all laws under those statutes. Each town varies on staff, some work full-time, some only part-time. Some towns have their own shelters located within the town and others lease or rent space from neighboring towns. Some towns have restrictions on how many animals you are allowed to own.

Animal Control Officers are an asset to an animal hoarding case. If there are animals in a home and you are unable to gain access an ACO may be able to do well-being checks to determine if the animals are healthy and or vaccinated. An ACO may be able to offer services to assist the hoarder with downsizing or spay/neuter. Sometimes a well-being check is a good way to get a foot in the door and further check on the hoarding situation.

Contact your local ACO and form a relationship with them. Speak with them about what type of facility they currently house their animals in, what and how many animals they are able to house. ACOs work closely with other towns and rescue groups in re-homing animals that come into their facilities.

# DMHAS - Emergency Crisis Services

Emergency crisis services are provided to individuals age eighteen (18) or older throughout the State of Connecticut. Crisis services are defined as readily accessible, rapid response, short term services for individuals and families experiencing episodes of acute behavioral health crises. Emergency crisis services are delivered in settings such as at the Local Mental Health Authority (LMHA), at any provider with a contract with DMHAS, at walk-in clinics or in other community settings through the use of emergency crisis teams rather than in a hospital emergency department.

- Emergency crisis services are provided in person following telephone screening when an individual is experiencing sudden, incapacitating emotional distress or other symptoms.
- Crisis services provide concentrated interventions to treat a rapidly deteriorating behavioral health condition, reduce risk of harm to self or others, stabilize psychiatric symptoms, behavioral, and situational problems, and whenever possible, avert the need for hospitalization.
- Crisis services focus on evaluation and stabilization activities which may include: assessment and evaluation, diagnosis, hospital pre-screening, medication evaluation and prescribing, targeted interventions and arrangement for further care and assistance as required.
- Crisis teams develop community partnerships with provider organizations that serve the community and have a stake in establishing and maintaining a seamless system of care. Organizations such as: Hospitals, emergency rooms and inpatient psychiatric units; local law enforcement; State-operated and private non-profit local mental health agencies; community mental health and substance abuse treatment service providers; primary health care providers; and other community providers/organizations, i.e., housing providers, recovery support service providers are included in such partnerships in order to promote a comprehensive person-centered recovery plan and disposition.
- The goal of the crisis team is to utilize the least restrictive setting, while promoting the individual's, dignity, their optimal functioning, goals identified in the service plan; at the same time prioritize real and potential clinical risk, based on the individual's present mental state, when formulating a disposition (i.e., hospitalization).

***Commitment Under Emergency Certification of Certain Licensed Clinical Social Workers and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses.*** Certain licensed clinical social workers (LCSWs) and advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) can issue emergency certificates authorizing people with mental illness to be taken to a general hospital for examination. To do this, they must reasonably believe, based on direct evaluation, that the person has a psychiatric disability, is dangerous to self or others or gravely disabled, and needs immediate care and treatment. The person must be examined within 24 hours and released within 72 hours unless he is committed to a psychiatric facility.

This applies to LCSWs and APRNs who, as members of mobile crisis teams, jail diversion programs, or assertive case management programs operated by, or under contract with, the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS), have received at least eight hours of specialized training in conducting these kinds of direct evaluations. (The DMHAS commissioner must collect statistical and demographic data on emergency certificates issued by LCSWs and APRNs) (CGS § 17a-503(d)).

***Commitment Under Physician's Emergency Certificate.*** Under §17a-502, a person may be confined for up to 15 days without a court order, pursuant to a physician's emergency certificate. The physician must have concluded that the person has psychiatric disabilities and is a danger to self or others or gravely disabled, and needs immediate care and treatment in a hospital for psychiatric disabilities. The certificate must state (1) the date of examination, which shall not be more than three days prior to the date of the certificate; (2) the physician's findings relative to the person's physical and psychiatric condition and the history of the case, if known; (3) the physician's opinion that the person has psychiatric disabilities and is dangerous to himself or others or gravely disabled and needs immediate care and treatment in a hospital for psychiatric disabilities; and (4) the reasons for his opinion (CGS § 17a-502(a)).

If a written application for commitment has been filed in probate court prior to the expiration of the 15 days, the emergency commitment may be continued for an additional 15 days or until completion of probate proceedings, whichever is sooner (CGS § 17a-502(a)). Any person admitted on an emergency basis must be examined by a psychiatrist within 24 hours of admission. If the psychiatrist determines that the person does not meet the criteria for emergency detention and treatment, he must be released (CGS § 17a-502(b)).

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### **Private Insurance**

**Home Care/Heavy Chore/Organizing:** If the client is over 60 a referral to Protective Services and/or home care (when the client is ready) is entrance into the system. The amount of services available will vary. A sliding scale is also available.

**For People 65 and Older or a Frail Elder:** SCO (Senior Care Options) works with people who hoard to provide heavy chore services. SCO participants have Medicare.

**For People 55 and Older and who are Nursing Home Eligible:** PACE (Program of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly) provides an option for older adults for a wraparound program of care. Home care and heavy chore can be part of this plan. Day programs provide an escape from social isolation and a chance to gain new interests and connections to people.

**Senior Centers and ASAP's:** These agencies often have funds available (small necessities or scholarships) to pay for a one time clean out/planned with the consumer or removal of items, or more.

**Department of Mental Health (DMH):** Does the client qualify for DMH services? If so, DMH is a potential option for service delivery. If already a client, the community worker might have the best relationship and can be trained to work with the client on discarding.

**Student Interns:** Psychology, Mental Health, Social Work, Human Services students can be a great resource for helping clients work in the home with supervision by a professional.

**Peer Support:** Pairing up two or more clients to help each other. Sometimes just the accountability piece is needed and clients can help each other by just being present in their home while the other does the work. Often times peer support will be an outcome of a peer support group.

**Volunteers:** It is true some people love to organize or are trying to start a business and want to offer some pro bono assistance. It is also possible to find volunteers, but they should be closely supervised and back ground checked

**Thinking Creatively/Outside the Box:** Inventive thinking is needed for a big one-time clean out (if and when the person is ready). You can often find coworkers, high school/college volunteers, AmeriCorps volunteers, etc.
