

The red painted numbers on the acetate stencil sheet included in the "Let's Start™" kit contain lead; and the gold paint bearing the words "Kasy's Extrafine" on the black pen included in the "Optical Illusions" kit has lead. The paint on some of the figurines contains excess levels of lead. If ingested over time by children, the lead from the paint may present a lead poisoning hazard. The paint on the "smiley face" zipper-pull attached to the sweat jacket of these garments contains lead. Young children could ingest lead from the zipper-pull, presenting a lead poisoning hazard. April 7, 2003	Candles with Lead-Core Wicks	<p>The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) voted unanimously to ban the manufacture and sale of lead-cored wicks and candles with lead-cored wicks. CPSC determined that candles using lead-cored wicks could present a lead poisoning hazard to young children. August 22, 2003	LITARGIRIO (The following advisory is based upon a Health Alert that was issued by the Rhode Island Department of Health on June 30, 2003)	<p>LITARGIRIO is a yellow or peach-colored powder manufacturer by Roldan, Ferreria and other laboratories in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. The powder is used as a traditional remedy, particularly by people from that country and contains nearly 80% lead.</p> <p>This product was first discovered in connection with a child in Rhode Island who was undergoing treatment for lead poisoning. The lead in the child's blood continued to climb to more than four times the allowable level, even after abating household sources and providing medical treatment. Upon further investigation the Rhode Island (RI) Health Department discovered that the family was using LITARGIRIO as a childhood antiperspirant/deodorant. Consumers also use the product as a traditional remedy for the treatment of fungus on the feet and for burns.</p> <p>It is reported that the product is readily available in various convenience and specialty stores that cater to Spanish-speaking clientele - particularly those from the Dominican Republic.</p> <p>RI Health has advised the public to stop all use of LITARGIRIO immediately -particularly with children and pregnant or nursing women.</p> <p>Additionally, the Connecticut Departments of Public Health and Environmental Protection (DEP) advise that homeowners should dispose of LITARGIRIO at a local household hazardous waste collection day rather than by disposal in the household trash. Much of Connecticut's solid waste is burned at resource recovery plants and any lead is likely to be emitted through the stack at such facilities. A listing of household hazardous waste collection events is posted on the DEP web site at http://www.dep.state.ct.us/wst/recycle/hhwsched.htm</p> <p>If a supermarket or other non-homeowner has LITARGIRIO in their inventory they must dispose of it through a licensed hazardous waste hauler.</p> <p>FDA also issued warnings (in English and Spanish) advising the public to "Stop any use of Litargirio, wash hands, other body parts and any household surfaces the powder came in contact with, and children, pregnant or nursing women using the product should be tested for lead poisoning."</p>

July 8, 2004	Metal Toy Jewelry Sold in Vending Machines	<p>The voluntary recall of 150 million pieces of toy jewelry sold in vending machines across America. CPSC has determined that some of this toy jewelry contains dangerous levels of lead, posing a risk of lead poisoning to children. Only about half of the 150 million pieces of toy jewelry actually contains lead, but, because it is difficult to distinguish the lead jewelry from the non-lead jewelry, the industry decided to recall all of it. The four firms are A & A Global Industries, Inc., of Cockeysville, Md.; Brand Imports, LLC, of Scottsdale, Ariz.; Cardinal Distributing Co. Inc., of Baltimore, Md.; and L. M. 

The new policy gives manufacturers, importers and retailers clear guidance on steps they should take to minimize the risk for children. The recalled metal charms were sold under the name “Charming Thoughts™.” Most of the charms are silver-colored with small silver loops. They were sold in packages of two to 12 pieces. The packages are marked “The Card Connection™,” “Charming Thoughts™” and “Hirschberg Schutz & Co. Inc.” The metal charms are various shapes including small hearts, crowns, birds, picture frames, perfume bottles and a cross. Some of the metal charms have small blue, pink or yellow stones and are printed with words including “princess,” “congratulations,” “city girl,” “world traveler” and “life’s blessings.” “Insert photo here,” “cherish,” “love,” and “honor” are printed on the picture frame charms. The nameplate on the necklace hangs from a 16-inch black cord. The necklace packages are marked "Personalized Necklace" and "Stravina". UPC Code 0-35203-00039-7 is on the necklace package. The recalled zipper pulls are silver-colored with individual names that come in various colors. The zipper pull hangs from a silver-colored metal clip designed to attach to a backpack, a keyring, and zippers on clothing. Printed on the zipper pull's packaging is "Personalized Zipper Pull," "Great for Backpacks and Keyrings too" and "Stravina." UPC Code 0-35203-00038-0 is written on the package.
