

STEPS TO FOLLOW WHEN LEAD IS IDENTIFIED DURING A COMPREHENSIVE LEAD INSPECTION IN A DAY CARE OR GROUP DAY CARE CENTER

CHILD DAY CARE
12 or more children CGS §19a-77(a)(1)

GROUP DAY CARE CENTERS
7 to 12 children CGS §19a-77(a)(2)

Is the Day Care housed in building constructed pre-1978?
Operator instructed to have a **Comprehensive Lead Inspection** completed within 30 days of notification by DPH Day Care or Lead Program or prior to DPH approval of a NEW Day Care License Application.

Comprehensive Lead Inspection completed

NO LEAD BASED PAINT HAZARD EXISTS
All lead-based paint found intact

LEAD BASED PAINT HAZARD EXISTS
deteriorated lead-based paint, exposed soil, or dust hazard identified

In some instances Abatement (e.g., replacement, removal, or encapsulation) may be preferred due to severe deterioration

Operator is required to prepare a **Lead Hazard Remediation Plan (aka Plan of Correction)**.
(The operator may be assisted by the Local Health Dept. (LHD), CT Dept. of Public Health (CT DPH) Lead Program staff, or may be required to hire a certified lead consultant contractor)

The **Lead Hazard Remediation Plan** must be submitted to the LHD for review and approval prior to work.

Lead Hazard Remediation
work must be done by an RRP certified contractor *

Once work is complete, a certified lead inspector or LHD inspector must do clearance dust wipes to ensure the work site was properly cleaned. Dust wipes must be done in every area where remediation work was done.

Do **INTACT** lead based painted surfaces remain?

Develop a **Lead Management Plan**; submit to **LHD** for review & approval.

Forward a copy of clearance dust wipe results and request an inspection and/or a **Post Remediation Compliance Letter** from the LHD

LHD provides a copy of the **Post Remediation Compliance Letter** to DPH Lead Program. (Lead Program forwards it to Day Care Licensing)

Day Care operator is required to maintain a copy of the approved Lead Management Plan on file and available for review by Day Care licensing staff during inspections.

* **RRP Certified Contractor**- is a firm & individual who has complied with EPA RRP rule requirements and has been trained in lead safe work practices
