

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Overview

- ◉ There are several sections of the regulations that require local health response for preventing childhood lead poisoning
 - Triggering the applicability of the regulations
 - HUD funded projects \geq \$25,000
 - Local ordinances

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What circumstances may you become involved with during your daily work involving lead paint?

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Non-EBLL Inspections

- ⦿ Other dwellings
- ⦿ Family daycares
- ⦿ Child <6 years of age in residence where lead hazards have been identified
- ⦿ Complaint-based

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Confirm findings??

- ⦿ If a private entity reports LITSF, the LHD must visually confirm that the inspection is complete and accurate

*Regardless of the health status of a child

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Next Steps...

- ⦿ The LHD must ensure that the inspection is comprehensive and includes all structures on the property
- ⦿ The LHD must then issue an order for abatement of all defective surfaces and management of all intact surfaces

Rehabilitation Funding....

- ⦿ Story from Norwalk
- ⦿ Public Housing Authorities, CDBG funds, CHFA funds, DOH funds, etc.
- ⦿ Monies > \$25, 000 (special consideration)

Overall Responsibility....

- ⦿ The DoH is also obligated to ensure that the subsequent work is carried out in a timely manner and compliance is achieved
