HPV Vaccine: Challenges and Opportunities

Vaccines against human papillomavirus have been available for adolescents in the US since 2006 but uptake remains suboptimal. Reasons for this are likely complex and multifactorial. The purpose of this presentation is to review evidence for strategies that work to increase coverage and identify opportunities that can be implemented in Connecticut.

2. Describe the current status of HPV vaccine uptake in the US and in CT
3. Understand key reasons for low coverage
4. Identify strategies that are effective for increasing coverage
