Many adolescents have medical and mental health disorders that require clinicians to understand different rules and various legal requirements while providing appropriate and confidential care. Using a combination of brief background lecture and short case study format, this program will examine clinicians' responsibilities and adolescents' rights regarding consent and confidentiality surrounding medical and mental health issues, the various specific federal and state laws guiding practice in these areas, and provide insight into how to handle health care issues that arise either as ancillary or primary issues in your practice.

Participants taking this course will be able to:

- Understand Connecticut law and its affect on adolescent confidentiality issues relating to both medical and mental health care;
- Understand the limits of consent and confidentiality regarding medical care for minors, including a breakdown of varied rules depending on the type of care setting or licenses of providers;
- Understand clinicians' obligations to protect adolescents' privacy and provide health care and;
- Understand the state's mandatory reporting guidelines, recognize safety concerns and understand the basics about mental health commitment proceedings.

Sheryl A. Ryan, MD, is an Associate Professor and Chief of Adolescent Medicine at Yale School of Medicine. She holds an M.D. from Yale University. She has served as a consultant to many school and health districts on adolescent health issues. She is also the author of numerous journal articles dealing with adolescents and high risk behaviors.
