Uncompensated Care Cost (UC Costs) are the costs hospitals incur providing care for which no payment was received from a patient or insurer (Charity Care or Bad Debt). Most of the hospitals incurring the highest UC Costs tend to be large urban hospitals, which are likely to be located in areas with a higher uninsured population. On a statewide average and median basis, the UC Costs trended downward in FY 2013.

UC Costs as a percentage of hospital net patient service revenue measures the impact on a hospital receipts of providing care to charity care patients and patients who are able but unwilling to pay. The statewide average and median have been trending downward. Being a large tertiary hospital is not necessarily indicative of a high percentage in this category. Further a lower net revenue amount may result in a higher percentage in this calculation.

The statewide average and median uninsured percent of total discharges had decreased slightly from FY12 - FY13. This may be the result of the increase in the number of people in the Medicaid program in FY13 as a first step in the roll out of Health Care Reform. The higher percentage may indicate a higher level of uninsured, a lower level of total discharges or a combination of both.
