

## STATE ANNOUNCES RECIPIENTS OF THE 2014 GOVERNOR'S ARTS AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE AND LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT

Governor Malloy Also to Recognize Supporters of the Arts

The state Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) today announced the recipients of the 2014 Governor's Arts Awards, which honor Connecticut artists who have demonstrated excellence and lifetime achievements in the arts.

"These remarkable individuals, and all artists in general, enrich the quality of life in Connecticut and the world," said Kip Bergstrom, deputy commissioner of DECD. "Connecticut is fortunate and proud to have this amazing group of artists living and working in our great state. The Governor's Arts Awards provides the opportunity to recognize and celebrate these extraordinary individuals."

The 2014 recipients are:

Christopher Plummer, film, TV and stage actor of Weston
Luanne Rice, New York Times bestselling author of Old Lyme

Established in 1978, the Governor's Arts Awards recognize artists, arts organizations, businesses, and educators for their outstanding service to the arts in Connecticut. Honorees are selected based on the magnitude, the level of recognition, and the sustained contribution to the arts their achievements cultivate. They must be residents of Connecticut.

Recipients of this year's awards will be honored by Governor Dannel P. Malloy on Saturday, June 14, with several events including:

- Panel Discussion, hosted by the by the International Festival of Arts & Ideas, with the recipients of the 2014 Governor's Arts Awards for Excellence and Lifetime Achievement, immediately following the award presentation, at Yale University Art Gallery, 1111 Chapel Street, New Haven;
- Arts Award Reception, Saturday, June 14, 4:30 p.m., at the Q Club, 221 Church Street, New Haven; and
- Re-Cap of the Governor's Arts Awards with Lt. Governor Nancy Wyman, Saturday, June 14, 2014, 7 p.m., the Elm Street Stage at the New Haven Green.
