OFFICE OF STATE ETHICS ANNOUNCES SETTLEMENT  
WITH FORMER UCONN EMPLOYEE

The Connecticut Office of State Ethics announced today that it entered into a Consent Order to resolve its complaint against Robin Danahy, a former employee of the UConn Athletics Department. The Consent Order calls for a penalty of \$5000 and prohibits Ms. Danahy from engaging in certain future conduct, including a prohibition from lobbying the University for the next three years.

According to the complaint, Ms. Danahy had approached Scoutware, a contractor of the University, concerning employment and did not disclose this fact when she participated on the selection committee that was considering whether to renew Scoutware's contract. The complaint alleged that in such a position, Ms. Danahy had a conflict of interest that she was required by law to disclose, but failed to do so. Danahy denied any misconduct, and noted that she received no financial benefit when she later accepted a position with the contractor.

The Consent Order brings finality to the Office's investigation of the matter. The Consent Order does not include any finding of liability against Scoutware or the University of Connecticut.
