SUBJECT: Control of Fish Disease and Parasites - Quinebaug Valley Hatchery

1. No truck or equipment from any other hatchery will be allowed on the grounds of the Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
2. Biologists working at the hatchery, marking fish, etc. will use boots, waders, foul weather gear, etc. furnished by the hatchery. No boots, waders, foul weather gear, fin clipping devices or other equipment previously used elsewhere will be used at the Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
3. The hatchery foreman will make certain that hatchery personnel do not remove boots, waders, foul weather gear, etc. from the hatchery premises. *except for normal use on the distribution trucks.*
4. No rolling stock from the Quinebaug Valley Hatchery will be allowed to enter any other hatchery.
5. No personnel other than the driver will be allowed on or in a distribution vehicle from Quinebaug Valley Hatchery. The general public will not be allowed on distribution vehicles from Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
6. No nets, pails, tubs, etc. from a distribution vehicle from another hatchery or any other source will be allowed on a distribution vehicle from Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
7. Quinebaug Valley Hatchery personnel visiting other hatcheries will not enter Quinebaug Valley Hatchery wearing the clothes or footwear which they wore while visiting another installation. Visitors from another hatchery will not be allowed on Quinebaug Valley Hatchery wearing clothes or footwear previously worn at another installation.
8. No vehicles other than Quinebaug Valley Hatchery vehicles will be allowed inside the chain link fence enclosing Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
9. No one other than Quinebaug Valley Hatchery personnel, supervisory personnel, maintenance personnel, and Hartford staff will be allowed beyond the visitor section without special authorization from the Commissioner, Deputy Commissioner or Supervisor of Fish Culture.
10. No eggs, other than from certified disease and parasite free sources, shall be brought into the Quinebaug Valley Hatchery.
11. Visitors with authorization to enter the hatchery beyond the visitors section will sterilize their footwear in a disinfectant solution provided prior to entering the main hatchery area. All personnel reentering the hatchery after having left the hatchery proper will sterilize their footwear in a disinfectant solution provided for this purpose.
