



The site includes:

- State of the art multi media classroom building for training civilian and military students in medical disaster preparedness
- Bivouac Pad for the Otilie W. Lundgren Memorial Mobile Field Hospital
- Climate Controlled Warehouse for the CT Department of Public Health's sensitive equipment
- Shower and Restroom building for trainees
- Vehicle Storage Building for CT-Dept. of Public Health
- Trench Rescue Prop for training firefighters in confined space emergencies
- Train prop with an at grade road crossing to train first responders to deal with an accident in a realistic environment
- Urban Search and Rescue Rubble Piles for canine training
- Technical Rescue training Areas for Shoring & Cutting ops

The training center provides civilian and military participants the opportunity to work side-by-side to learn, practice, and integrate rescue, medical, logistical and leadership skills for responding to real time disasters:

- Natural/Manmade Disaster Chemical, Biological Radiological, Nuclear, or High Yield Explosive (CBRNE)
- Infectious Disease Outbreaks
- Mass Casualty Disaster Response Requiring Deployment of the Mobile Field Hospital
