Lauren Henault Bidra Staff Attorney 2

Lauren Henault Bidra joined the OCC as a Staff Attorney 2 in August 2012. Lauren focuses mainly on electricity and gas issues, and her practice includes appearances before Public Utilities Regulatory Authority (PURA), the Siting Council, and various Connecticut courts. Prior to joining the OCC, Lauren practiced at a law firm in Hartford where she primarily litigated but also represented clients in business matters.
