

## **Overview**

The Office of Chief Medical Examiner is accredited by the National Association of Medical Examiners. The working environment is in a modern professional setting and it is a short walk to the UConn Medical School, which has an academic relationship with the Office of Chief Medical Examiner. Offices have window views, a supportive professional staff and an excellent quality of work life. The Medical Examiner's office has access to a wide array of professional consultative services and enjoys excellent community relationships with the State's major hospitals, crime lab and the law enforcement community.

## **Experience and Training**

Prospective applicants must be certified in anatomic pathology by the American Board of Pathology, and eligible to be board certified in forensic pathology within two years of employment. Applicants completing a fellowship or forensic pathology training will be considered. Candidates must have a license to practice medicine and surgery in Connecticut. A temporary license may be granted for a period not to exceed one year.

## **Duties**

Responsibilities include performing autopsies (250-275 per year) and supporting functions such as decision making, setting priorities, completing supporting reports, submission of findings, courtroom testimony consisting of about 10-15 appearances per year, depositions and reviewing investigative reports. Teaching responsibilities with rotating students is strongly encouraged. Required work rotations include on call evenings/nights every 5<sup>th</sup> night and weekend work (rotations posted on a yearly basis).

## **Compensation/Benefits**

The starting annual salary will range from \$164,496 to \$173,719 (depending on number of Board certifications) plus on call compensation.

Evening/night on-call pay is \$280/8-hr shift. Weekend office pay is \$640/8-hr shift.
