

6. EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES: The parties shall consult with each other prior to enrolling any of the children in extra curricular activities; the children will continue any activities they are currently enrolled in and both parents bear responsibility for transportation to and from these activities on the days that the children are with him or her.

7. Neither party will speak negatively about the other to, or in the presence of, the minor children. The parties will not allow others to speak negatively about the other parent.

8. VACATIONS AND HOLIDAYS: shall be alternated according to the attached calendar and shall supercede the regular parenting plan outlined above.

SAMPLE HOLIDAY ARRANGEMENT

FATHER'S DAY – shall be with father. This day shall be defined as Saturday 6:00 p.m. until Sunday at 6:00 p.m.

MOTHER'S DAY – shall be with mother. This day shall be defined as Saturday at 6:00 p.m. until Sunday at 6:00 p.m.

EASTER – The child(ren) shall enjoy Easter morning with the parent with whom they spent the night. Morning shall be defined as lasting until 2:00 pm Easter Day. The child(ren) shall enjoy Easter afternoon with the other parent. Afternoon shall be defined as starting at 2:00 pm and lasting until 6:00 pm. The child(ren) shall spend Easter night and with the parent who is regularly scheduled for that night. No special provisions were made for Good Friday. The parents shall follow the parenting plan, as outlined in this Agreement.

THANKSGIVING – Mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company on Thanksgiving in all odd numbered years, and father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company in all even numbered years. Thanksgiving shall be from Wednesday at 3:30 p.m. until Friday at 7:30 p.m.

CHRISTMAS EVE/CHRISTMAS DAY - Father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company on Christmas Eve at 6:00 PM until Christmas Day at 3:00 PM and the Mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company on Christmas Day from 3:00 PM until December 26th at 3:00 PM in all odd numbered years. Mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company on Christmas Eve at 6:00 PM until Christmas Day at 3:00 PM and the Father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company on Christmas Day from 3:00 PM until December 26th at 3:00 PM in all even numbered years.

NEW YEAR'S EVE/NEW YEAR'S DAY - Mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company for New Year's Eve/Day in all odd numbered years. Father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company for New Year's Eve/Day in all even numbered years. New Year's Eve/Day shall be from December 31st at 3:00 PM until January 1 at 6:00 PM.

MONDAY HOLIDAYS – Monday holidays shall be enjoyed by the parent whose weekend it follows. The transition time shall be identical to the traditional Sunday time.

WINTER BREAK – The mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company in all even numbered years. The father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company in all odd numbered years. The Winter Break shall be defined as after school the Friday before the vacation starts until a week later on Friday at 3:00 PM.

SPRING BREAK – The mother shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company in all even numbered years. The father shall enjoy the child(ren)'s company in all odd numbered years. The Spring Break vacation shall be defined as after school the Friday before the vacation starts until a week later on Friday at 3:00 PM.

PLANNED VACATIONS - Mother and Father may elect to take the child(ren) away on vacation for a period of up to two weeks each year. If a longer vacation is desired, the parties must agree in writing. Vacation travel supercedes the routine parenting times described above. Vacations may not interfere with the child(ren)'s school schedule, including summer school, without the written consent of both parents. Each parent must notify the other at least 30 days in advance of vacation plans, including travel itinerary and telephone numbers. The parents shall make a good faith effort to plan extended vacations over their own parenting weekends. In the event that the vacation plans overlap and the parties are not able to make satisfactory adjustments in their plans that will permit the child(ren) to enjoy vacations with each of them, then Mother's preference will prevail during odd numbered years and Father's preference will prevail during even numbered years.
