The Council supports its mission to strengthen and extend a statewide program to conserve and protect the land and water resources of Connecticut through its legislative charge of coordinating projects of the Conservation Districts with other state, regional and local agencies on various natural resource and land use projects.

The Northeastern Forest Fire Protection Commission (Compact) was established in June of 1949, under the auspices of an agreement between the Governors of the New England States, New York, Quebec and New Brunswick. The Compact coordinates a program providing for the exchange of personnel and equipment in emergency situations. Although the Compact owns no equipment, a cooperative understanding provides that manpower and equipment will be furnished as needed and as available when a fire emergency arises. The Compact is made up of three representatives from each State or Province.

New England Interstate Water Pollution Commission

Agency Description:

The New England Interstate Water Pollution Control Commission was established in 1947 to assist its compact member states in the management and protection of water quality and help the New England states and New York cooperatively address interstate water issues, challenges and conflicts. DEEP agreed, through the compact, to pay annual dues that are assessed by the Commission. This payment is very cost effective given the services and benefits. DEEP will no longer be able to support membership dues; therefore, losing a valuable resource, forum, efficiencies and significant assistance to work on water pollution, water quality, wastewater and water supplies, nonpoint source, wetlands, groundwater issues that affect our region or the state. The Commission's assistance is especially valuable with respect to actions of upper CT River basin states and such impacts affecting Long Island Sound. The compact requires that the commissioners of Energy and Environmental Protection and Public Health be members and failure to meet compact obligations may result in legal actions.

Mosquito Control

Agency Description:

Mosquito control is not part of the Agency/BNR core mission. Would terminate DEEP monitoring of mosquito breeding pools and treatment with larvicides on state land and adjacent marshes. Terminate ground spraying of adult mosquitoes on state land. Agency will maintain permanent staff with mosquito control experience but would no longer be able to take preventative measures or respond quickly in the event of an outbreak. Potential health and safety issues in the event of a disease outbreak. Particular concern for addressing EEE outbreak as occurred in 2013. Reduction in seasonal staffing will also reduce capacity of proactive wetlands management program.

Agency Description:

Between Memorial Day and Labor Day, DEEP's seasonal workforce makes up 87% of staff in the state park system. In addition, seasonals are utilized by DEEP's EnCor Division to patrol campgrounds, lakes, Long Island Sound, parks and forests. DEEP's Boating Division utilizes seasonals to prevent the spread of invasive species and promote safe boating. This seasonal budget reduction exacerbates the current challenges of staffing the state's park and forest system for the 8 to 9 million annual visitors. As a result of this reduction, public services may be significantly limited during the summer recreational season. Specific impacts include: reducing operations at dozens of state parks, forests and boat ramps. Two collateral impacts associated with this reduction: fixed costs associated with utilities and fuel will be reduced as a result of significantly curtailed operations; revenue to the state will be diminished as a result of campground closures, fewer parks and forests charging parking fees and decreased visitation.

Such delays or limitations to emergency mitigation measures would likely result in further pollution and contamination of land or water and increase the associated exposure threat to human health and wildlife.

Agency Title:

State Superfund Site Maintenance

Agency Description:

The state is currently obligated by contract with the federal government to perform O&M at two Fund-Lead Federal Superfund Sites. These are being maintained and monitored to ensure the safety of the public and the environment following the implementation of the final remedy which was 90% federally funded. A Superfund-State Contract (SSC) and an MOA (Memorandum of Agreement) was executed pursuant to federal law between EPA and the State for assignment of response costs including Operation and Maintenance (O&M) at two sites. Section K of the SSC obligates the State to provide 100% of the Operation and Maintenance of the remedy. Section Y of the SSC (Failure to Comply with Terms of the Contract) states: If the State fails to comply with the terms of the SSC, the EPA may proceed under the provisions of the Section 104(d)(2) of CERCLA and may seek in the appropriate Federal district court of competent jurisdiction to enforce the Contract. Reduction of the current level of funding is therefore expected to subject the State to legal action by EPA to enforce the terms of the SSC and the MOA. This may be a national precedent issue for the EPA and will become a high priority matter for them.
