

The Connecticut Police Academy was honored by a visit on November 6, 2009, from U.S. Senator Joseph Lieberman, Chairman of the U.S. Senate Homeland Security Commission.

Our academy received a \$350,000 grant in 2004-05 to conduct the first 40-hour recruit training curriculum on topics of Weapons of Mass Destruction, Personal Protection Equipment, Incident Command, ITAC Communications, HazMat and suicide bombers to all recruits.

Senator Lieberman spoke to the new recruit class Session #327 about their decision to join law enforcement and the major role they will play in making all citizens of Connecticut safe. He accented the need for integrity, honesty and good decision-making characteristics.
