IV. Administrative Reports

Mr. Brandi updated commission staff on the processing of commission grants. All staff has been doing a tremendous job in moving the applications along.

Mr. Brandi reported that eCRIS filings are exceeding expectations. For CEP candidates filings on eCRIS is in excess of 83% which is making our job much easier in terms of time lines where the applications are processed immediately upon receipt instead of having them data entered for paper filers which costs an extra day and as well as the data entry cost.

Mr. Brandi advised that for the recent July filings, there were 1091 committees, 96% filed on time with 55% via eCRIS. Outreach to committees related to eCRIS seems to be working well.

Mr. Brandi reported that as of today, there are 383 registered candidate committees for the upcoming election. 207 have already declared to participate in the CEP. We expect that number to rise.

Mr. Brandi updated that as of today, 82 CEP grants have been approved, before the ones we act on today. The blackout period for the primary will be ending today, so general applications will be processed.

Mr. Brandi reported that ongoing training sessions for treasurers have been well received. Attendance has been very high and we are getting a lot of good education out there and participation with the treasurers.

Mr. Brandi advised that, there is a statutory Governors' report which SEEC will prepare in August.

Mr. Brandi reported that two new accounting trainees will be starting this Friday. This is a result of the additional help that was given to us in the budget starting for July 1, 2012. They will commence their employment with the agency on Friday and their training will start immediately
