IV. Administrative Reports

At 9:30 am on Friday SEEC will be observing a moment of silence regarding the Newtown tragedy.

Mr. Brandi reported that there is a Special Session being held at the legislature today regarding budget. Mr. Brandi anticipates that SEEC will suffer additional operating cuts as a result of today's session. SEEC has already agreed to a voluntary one percent rescission, but does anticipate additional cuts.

Mr. Brandi advised the Commission that SEEC still has 4 vacancies to fill. The Director of Campaign Disclosure and Audit position has been tested and closed. SEEC is now awaiting the score results from DAS. The Legal Investigator position was tested on December 12, 2012 and we are awaiting those results. SEEC also has the Associate Accounts Examiner and Accounts Examiner position to fill.

Mr. Brandi reported that SEEC audit staff is already getting ready for the season to begin candidate committee audits. Letters have been issued to those who have been selected for audit as well as those who have not been selected for audit.

Mr. Brandi advised the Commission that SEEC has received notification of RBA to start this session. Staff is preparing those documents and updates now to be presented to the legislature for hearings.

Mr. Brandi updated the Commission on construction plans, regarding a meeting that was held with SEEC, DPW and OGA. A recommendation is being made that all construction efforts be halted until DPW can analyze the possibility of moving all agencies out of this building to allow for the demolition and rebuild of the building.

Mr. Brandi reported that SEEC's legislative concepts have been prepared for its' agenda this year. Regarding legislation, this is a budget season and SEEC is ready to

fight for its' agency budget as well as the CEP. SEEC is hoping that the CEP will be preserved with the funding that is presently in place.

It was moved by Commissioner Jenkins and seconded by Commissioner Stankevicius to adopt Pursuant to its authority under General Statutes § 9-7b, “the State Elections Enforcement Commission (“the Commission”) hereby authorizes agency staff to investigate the discovery of numerous boxes of unprocessed agency paperwork at the Hartford regional office of the Connecticut Department of Social Services in or about November 2012. Specifically, the Commission authorizes an investigation into whether the Department of Social Services and/or its Commissioner Roderick L. Bremby, may have failed to meet the statutory obligations of “elections agencies” under General Statutes §§ 9-19h, and 9-23j through 9-23o, inclusive”. So voted.

9b. In Re: SEEC Initiated, Christina Ayala and Santa Ayala

Attorney Ahern requested the Commission approve the initiation of an investigation.

It was moved by Commissioner Jenkins and seconded by Commissioner Stankevicius to adopt Pursuant to its authority under General Statutes § 9-7b, “the State Elections Enforcement Commission (“the Commission”) hereby authorizes agency staff to investigate whether Christina Ayala was a bona fide resident at 604 Noble Ave. in the City of Bridgeport when she registered to vote there on or about October 5, 2011 and did vote there November 8, 2011, August 14, 2012, September 4, 2012 and November 6, 2012 and whether Christina Ayala improperly voted on the above dates by virtue of not being legally qualified to vote in such elections or primaries”.

“Additionally, the Commission hereby authorizes agency staff to investigate whether Santa Ayala, the Democratic Registrar of Voters of the City of Bridgeport, failed to perform her duties under General Statutes §§ 9-35 and 9-38 concerning the registration of her daughter Christina Ayala at 604 Noble Avenue in the City of Bridgeport from October 5, 2011 to the present”. So voted.

10. Non-Filer Investigations and Prosecutions

- a. Pursuant to Section 9-7b-35 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, Proposed Findings for a Reason to Believe a Violation has been Committed Concerning Delinquent Filings, Violations Under Section 9-608(a) (1). Based upon referrals by the SEEC Campaign Disclosure and Audit Unit.

So voted.
