I. *Call to Order*

Chairman Castagno was present and called the meeting to order at 9:08 A.M. Commissioners Stephen Penny, Michael Ajello and Patricia Stankevicius were present, agency staff was also present.

It was moved by Commissioner Penny and seconded by Commissioner Stankevicius to move items 11 and 10 from public session to executive session 1A and 1B respectively. So voted.

II. *Approval of the Minutes*

Approval of the Minutes of the Meeting of December 18, 2013

It was moved by Commissioner Penny and seconded by Commissioner Stankevicius to approve the Minutes of the December 18, 2013 regular meeting. So voted.

III. *Administrative Reports*

Mr. Brandi updated the Commission that SEEC budget is on track. We will be attending next month the FAC advisory board meeting in order to move funds between our two existing accounts.

Mr. Brandi reported that SEEC staff is in full mode for the 2014 statewide and general assembly elections. Staff has been working on advisory opinions, new forms and the declaratory rulings.

SEEC is almost fully staffed. We are short one accounts examiner and as of today have received 70 applications for the position which has been posted. SEEC is moving forward to fill this position quickly.

Regarding the CEP and the CEF, SEEC has scheduled meetings with the comptroller's office to discuss processes relative to the end of the fiscal year and grant funding. Setting up the temporary account to allow SEEC to fund the grants without delays.

Mr. Brandi updated that regarding CEF projections, at the end of June this year, ending this fiscal year, we will have 31.6 million in the CEF and as of July 1 we start our 2015 fiscal year allotment which will be approximately 11.2 million which will be coming into the account as well. SEEC believes the account is sufficient to meet the needs of the 2014 election cycle.

The January 10th filings have been completed. SEEC currently has 38 non-filers for this period. Regarding registrations, there are more than 50 candidate committees which have registered for the 2014 election.

There is a special election, scheduled for February 25th to fill the vacancy by Senator Harp. We have two candidates which have registered with SEEC and we expect a third. SEEC will need to schedule a special meeting for grants.

SEEC is starting meetings regarding legislative initiatives which include the municipal pilot program, the fix to the CEF and the commission review of bank statements for committees which are not selected for audit.

Regarding the municipal pilot program, SEEC conducted a survey amongst the town clerks. Currently 107 of 169 town clerks have responded to the survey and of that group 93% are in support of the SEEC taking over the responsibility of being the central repository of all filings.

The audit unit has been doing a tremendous job that within the next two months we will have completed all 2010 and 2012 audits. We are looking to fill the one vacancy we have and we are looking to some build back up systems and redundancies and looking at all process right now to make sure that with the grant season coming up we will have a streamline process.
