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## **DRAFT MINUTES STATE ELECTIONS ENFORCEMENT COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Conference Room August 22, 2012 9:00 A.M.**

### ***I. Call to Order***

Chairman Cashman was present and called the meeting to order at 9:01 A.M. Commissioners Anthony Castagno, Joan Jenkins and Patricia Stankevicius were present. Agency staff was also present.

### ***III. Administrative Report***

Mr. Brandi advised that the progress for the CEP program is proceeding quite rapidly. There are currently 231 participating candidates in the CEP. Including today's meeting there will be 146 grants that have been approved. We have a total of 383 registered committees so we believe that a 250-260 estimate for participating candidates is consistent with the 2010 and 2008 election cycles.

There are total of 1,000 committees that we are monitoring for purposes of their quarterly filings. We are happy to report that the number of non-filers is very small.

Mr. Brandi updated Commission staff regarding budget. Budget planning has begun we are looking at the new budget for the next biennium. We are trying to make sure that we have sufficient funding and appropriate personnel available to handle all

matters that come before the Commission for the coming years. We will be analyzing starting today with OGA staff

SEEC is in the process of compiling required statutory reports for submission by September 1<sup>st</sup> including the Governor's Report and the Digest of Administrative Reports to the Governor 2011-2012.

Mr. Brandi reported that construction of the new offices, the time frame is for post election because of the nature of the move. The construction of the new offices on the first floor will take place somewhere after the November elections this way staff will not be disrupted

Mr. Brandi updated that the legislative agenda is being formulated and moving forward. Session is a few months away, but we are starting to focus on narrow, very point specific recommendations to be made to the legislature. A couple of the items we are looking at is the Commissioner terms, and additional funding to the CEF to make sure that we are properly funded for the 2014 Statewide's in particular. We will also be monitoring that for whatever changes are being proposed again for the program.

One big initiative we are looking to make is the municipal filings in consult with the Town Clerk's Association. We are looking to see if we can utilize eCRIS and the technology we have here and available servers that we have to basically have SEEC become the central repository for municipal filings statewide. So that we can have a searchable indexed filing for all candidates running for office. We are going to be discussing that further with the town clerks at their convention and also certainly the legislature.
