***I. Call to Order***

Chairman Cashman was present and called the meeting to order at 9:01 A.M. Commissioners Anthony Castagno and Patricia Stankevicius were present, Commissioner Joan Jenkins was present via teleconference. Agency staff was also present.

***III. Administrative Reports***

Mr. Brandi updated that SEEC is working hard to get through the balance of the CEP season.

Mr. Brandi advised that regarding personnel issues, SEEC is working with DAS to fill the vacancies for the Lead Legal Investigator position and the Director of Disclosure and Audit unit.

Mr. Brandi reported that there are 386 registered committees, 259 who are participating candidates in the CEP, and with today's Commission Meeting there will be 204 grants approved for this current election season.

Mr. Brandi advised that SEEC has submitted the budget for the 2014-2015 year. SEEC is going to be seeking some additional positions, mostly in administrative such as another office assistant. SEEC is also looking to add another IT analyst for software purposes fitting in with a legislative concept.

In the last two weeks Mr. Brandi and staff have attended both the town clerks convention as well as the registrar of voters' convention. IT Manager Hasen has produced a phenomenal demonstration, for the municipalities as we are looking to potentially take over, as a central repository, the municipal filings statewide. The reception that we received for this idea at both conventions was well received. We had volunteers from at least 15 communities to be pilot towns. SEEC's demonstration showed how to utilize each existing town's website, and working through their own websites, to allow for electronic filings to come directly to SEEC. Every website would be tailored to each individual town for the various positions they have.

Mr. Brandi updated that SEEC is awaiting our final report from the Auditors of Public Accounts.

Mr. Brandi reported that the regarding the intern program, SEEC is trying to bring in multiple layers of interns to help, notably with trying to move a lot of physical records into electronic format. SEEC is trying to make a systemic effort to have one move for the paper into electronic format in preparation for the construction on the first floor in November.


**VIII. Adjournment**
