I. Call to Order

Commissioner Castagno was present and called the meeting to order at 9:00 A.M. Commissioners Salvatore Bramante, Michael Ajello and Stephen Penny were present.

Mr. Brandi updated that at this point in time, the agency will have a surplus to deliver back to the general fund this year. SEEC has made all necessary expenditures in or has been managing its' budget very carefully.

Mr. Brandi advised that personnel wise, all of our positions are filled.

Mr. Brandi reported that staff is working at maximum capacity due to the grant season. Overtime has been assigned as necessary in order to process grant applications. This past week alone included 5 statewide applications. The size of the campaigns have strained our resources staff wise. The staff is performing at a very high level. Currently there are over 400 active candidate committees that we are monitoring and assisting.

Mr. Brandi updated that SEEC's IT unit has been working with campaigns by signing them up and assisting with eCRIS, holding training sessions and doing everything necessary to make sure that we can get as many campaigns as possible

into eCIS and utilizing the electronic systems. The more we can automate and bring into eCRIS lessens the amount of paper that staff has to review.

Mr. Brandi reported that regarding the grant schedule, we are at a very high pace right now. We are ahead of schedule as we compare back against 2010 and 2012 cycles. Numbers show that more campaigns are coming in and applying early.

Mr. Brandi updated that with regard to the DGA lawsuit against the SEEC at this point in time Judge Hall has denied the preliminary injunction filed by the DGA. By denying that motion we are back to looking at coordination the way the commission staff has interpreted it and the way the legislature has written it. It does not appear at this point in time that they are going to appeal that decision.
