### **STATE ELECTIONS ENFORCEMENT COMMISSION SEES INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PRIMARIES SINCE 2006 AND AWARDS FINAL PRIMARY ELECTION GRANTS**

**HARTFORD, CT**— July 24, 2008 – Today’s State Election Enforcement Commission meeting was the last in which candidates participating in the August 12th primary could receive grants from the Citizen’s Election Program. There are twenty primaries for state legislative races --- four Senate and sixteen for House of Representatives. This is almost a two-fold increase in the number of primaries from 2006.

Of the forty-two candidates participating in the August 12th primary, thirty-seven have chosen to participate in the Citizens’ Election Program. Thirty-four have applied for and received primary election grants.

At the July 23rd Commission meeting twenty-seven public grants from the Citizens’ Election Fund were awarded. ## SEEC Grants Awards to Candidate Only Three Commission Meetings Remain

HARTFORD, CT – September 26, 2008 – The State Elections Enforcement Commission approved 27 grant applications at the Commission meeting Wednesday. The grant application deadline is October 10<sup>th</sup>

The final three Commission meetings to consider grant applications are October 1<sup>st</sup>, October 8<sup>th</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>. Candidates who have not yet applied for a grant must submit their applications before 5:00 p.m. October 2<sup>nd</sup> to be considered at the October 8<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Commission has encouraged applicants to apply early to avoid missing critical deadlines which would result in failure to qualify for a grant.

To date, 270 candidates have declared that they intend to participate in the Citizens' Election Program for the 2008 General Election; 62 State Senate candidates and 208 State Representative candidates.

Since the program was launched June 3, 2008, 155 candidates have received General Election Grants from the Citizens' Election Program; 22 State Senate grants and 133 State Representative grants.
