



Profile of the Uninsured in Connecticut

As income decreases, the likelihood of being uninsured increases


Uninsured rate for non-elderly Connecticut residents (age 0-64) by income level


87% of uninsured people, those who earn <400% FPL, will have access to federal insurance subsidies

Uninsured rate among Connecticut residents (age 0-64) by family work status




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
