



Southbury Larkin State Park Trail

Trail Highlights

This trail is a section of a 9-mile continuous trail that begins in Southbury and ends in Naugatuck. This 3-mile section begins at Kettletown Road and then travels about 0.4 miles before it meets Jeremy Swamp Road. The trail then goes another 1.2 miles before crossing Curt Smith Road, and then a short distance more before crossing Southford Road. (The trail surface on either side of Southford Road is poor and may wash out during wet conditions.) After another 0.5 miles, the trail reaches its endpoint at the Oxford town line, where it connects with Oxford's portion of the trail.

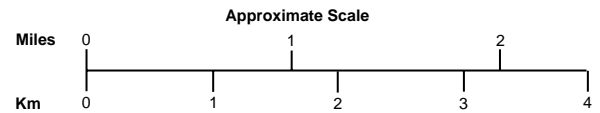
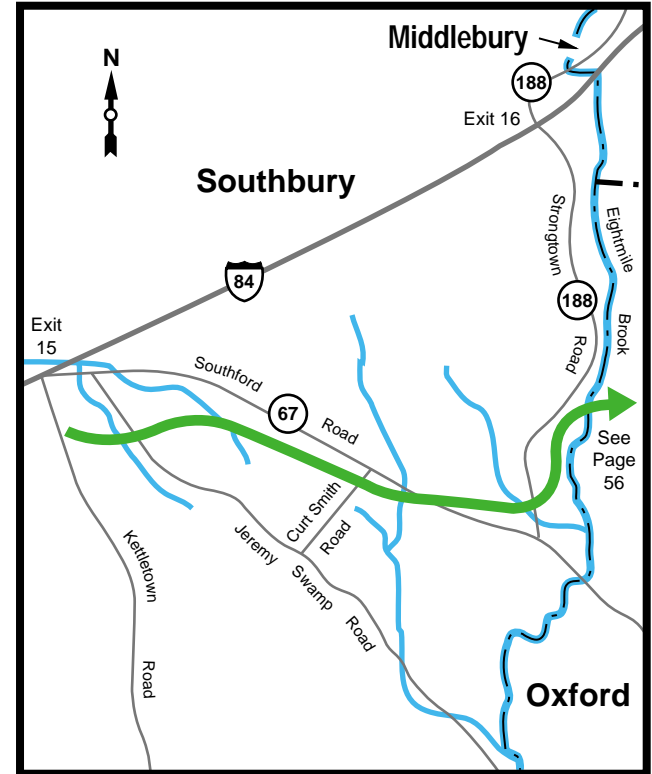
Remember, horses have the right of way.

Parking and Accessibility

Limited parking is available on the east side of Strongtown Road.

From I-84: Take exit 15 to Route 67 South. Follow Route 67 South to Kettletown Road. Turn right onto Kettletown Road. The trail head will be on the left after a short distance.
