Re: Declaratory Ruling No. 2016-A

Universal Health Care Foundation of Connecticut supports Common Cause in Connecticut's petition that Insurance Commissioner Wade recuse herself from the review of the Anthem-Cigna merger, due to her conflict of interest.

It is the Insurance Commissioner's duty to protect Connecticut residents in the health insurance market. This includes reviewing the proposed Aetna-Humana and Anthem-Cigna mergers. Residents of Connecticut are relying on the Commissioner to provide fair and unbiased scrutiny of these mergers and ensure that consumers are not harmed.

Given the information that has come to light, we do not see how the public can be assured that Commissioner Wade's review and ruling in the Anthem-Cigna merger will be free from insurance industry influence. The following facts bring into question Commissioner Wade's ability to remain objective in this matter:

1. Her husband's current employment as counsel for Cigna.
2. Her past employment as a lobbyist for Cigna from 1992-2013.
3. Her holding office in the Connecticut Association of Health Plans from 2005-2013.
4. The incomplete, inaccurate, and intentionally misleading information provided by Commissioner Wade to the State Ethics Commission's original ruling in this matter.
5. Her refusal to provide complete information in response to Freedom of Information requests.
6. The overwhelming evidence published in the International Business Times by David Sirota, from documents he procured via the Freedom of Information Act.

We urge you to rule that Commissioner Wade cannot oversee the review of the Anthem-Cigna merger, and that she must recuse herself in this matter.

Please see attached letter and signed petition, sent to Governor Malloy on June 5, 2016. This letter and petition, signed by over 600 people, asked Governor Malloy to intervene in this matter and call on Commissioner Wade to resign.

Dear Governor Malloy,

I am writing to express Universal Health Care Foundation of Connecticut's deep concern regarding the Insurance Department's handling of the review of the Anthem-Cigna and Aetna-Humana mergers and, in particular, the flawed leadership of Commissioner Katharine Wade. In light of the ever-growing scrutiny of Commissioner Wade's personal and professional conflicts, the Department's lack of responsiveness to calls for an open, robust and public-friendly review process, and her tone deaf refusal to recuse herself, we see no other course of action than to call on you to ask Commissioner Wade to resign.

We were very disappointed to hear of Commissioner Wade's secretive nod of approval for the Aetna-Humana merger four months after the decision. The Anthem-Cigna merger will directly impact 1.5 million state residents and many more health care policyholders throughout the nation. It is imperative that Connecticut's review of this merger is pristine - above reproach. At this point, we see nothing but a dark shadow on the Anthem-Cigna review and it is cast by Commissioner Wade's inadequate oversight.

We have attached a petition signed by over 500 individuals calling on you to ask Commissioner Wade to resign. We ask that you seriously consider this request. The Foundation stands ready to help ensure that the Anthem-Cigna review process is done right and that people's voices are heard loud and clear.

Mary	Cookson	<p>I am worried about the effect this merger could have on the cost of premiums. In 2015 my husband myself and my under 26 year old son were covered under Cobra through Cigna. Our premiums were \$2352.67 per month. During that year my son aged out of dependent coverage and our premium dropped under cobra Cigna to a cost of \$1895.59 for my husband and myself. My son was given an excessive cobra Cigna individual premium of \$941.99 per month. He works a full time job for a European based company with not many employees in the US, they do not offer health care coverage to their employees so he needs to purchase individual health care insurance. When open enrollment for the Connecticut exchange rolled around for December we switched to an Aetna silver policy that seemed comparable in coverage to our Cigna plan. My husband and I are covered \$1865 per month. My son was able to get his coverage for a premium of \$343.89 per month. This is similar coverage for one third the price of the comparable Cigna policy we had for him under Cobra. A week or so ago I received a notice that Aetna was applying for permission to raise rates on the exchange a very astronomical 28%.
